GENERAL Y. GOWON, Head of the Federal Military Government, Commander-in-Chief of the Armed Forces

WHEREAS by section 50 (2) of the Constitution of the former Eastern Nigeria as modified by the Constitution (Suspension and Modification) Decree 1966 and the States (Creation and Transitional Provisions) Decree 1967 it is provided that the High Court of the East-Central State shall consist of the Chief Justice and such number of other Judges (not being less than six) as may be prescribed by law :

AND WHEREAS by section 51 (1) of the Constitution of the former Eastern Nigeria modified as aforesaid it is provided that the Chief Justice and the other Judges of the High Court shall be appointed by the Supreme Military Council, acting after consultation with the Advisory Judicial Committee :

Now THEREFORE, THE SUPREME MILITARY COUNCIL, acting after consultation with the Advisory Judicial Committee, do hereby appoint MR JUSTICE MOSES ONUORA BALONWU as Chief Justice of the East-Central State with effect from 29th September 1971.

WHEREAS by section 48 (2) of the Constitution of Mid-Western State as modified by the Constitution (Suspension and Modification) Decree 1967 it is provided that the Judges of the High Court of Mid-Western State shall be the Chief Justice of the State and such number of other Judges (not being less than six) as may be prescribed by law:

AND WHEREAS by section 49 (3) of the Constitution of the Mid-Western State modified as aforesaid it is provided that if the office of any Judge of the High Court other than the Chief Justice is vacant or if the person holding the office is acting as Chief Justice or is for any reason unable to perform the functions of his office, the Supreme Military Council, acting after consultation with the Advisory Judicial Committee, may appoint a person with such qualifications as may be prescribed by law to act in the office of a Judge of the High Court:

Now THEREFORE, THE SUPREME MILITARY COUNCIL, acting after consultation with the Advisory Judicial Committee do hereby appoint JOSIAH AJASA POUTINKUMO OKI to act as a Judge of the High Court of Mid-Western State for a period of six months commencing on 15th August 1971.

AND WHEREAS by section 51 (4) of the Constitution of the former Eastern Nigeria modified as aforesaid it is provided that if the office of any Judge of the High Court other than the Chief Justice is vacant or if the person holding the office is acting as Chief Justice or is for any reason unable to perform the functions of his office, the Supreme Military Council, acting after consultation with the Advisory Judicial Committee, may appoint a person with such qualifications as may be prescribed by law to act in the office of a Judge of the High Court :

Now THEREFORE, THE SUPREME MILITARY COUNCIL, acting after consultation with the Advisory Judicial Committee, do hereby appoint ELIJAH ALLSWELL-URANTA to act as a Judge of the High Court of South-Eastern State from 15th August 1971 to 27th November 1971.

WHEREAS by section 4 (1) of the Sharia Court of Appeal Law of the former Northern Nigeria as modified by the States (Creation and Transitional Provisions) Decree 1967 it is provided that the Sharia Court of Appeal shall consist of a Grand Kadi, a Deputy Grand Kadi and three other Judges learned in the Sharia :


AND WHEREAS by section 54 (2) of the Constitution of the former Northern Nigeria as modified by the Constitution (Suspension and Modification) Decree 1966 and the States (Creation and Transitional Provisions) Decree 1967 it is provided that if the person holding the office of the Grand Kadi is for any reason unable to perform the functions of his office, those functions shall be performed by such one of the other Judges of the Sharia Court of Appeal as may from time to time be designated in that behalf by the Supreme Military Council, acting after consultation with the Advisory Judicial Committee :

Now THEREFORE, THE SUPREME MILITARY COUNCIL, acting after consultation with the Advisory Judicial Committee, do hereby appoint ABUBAKAR MOHAMOUD YOLA to act as Grand Kadi of the Sharia Court of Appeal of the Northern States with effect from 20th September 1971 during the absence on vacation leave of the Grand Kadi.

WHEREAS by section 4 (1) of the Sharia Court of Appeal Law of the former Northern Nigeria as modified by the States (Creation and Transitional Provisions) Decree 1967 and as amended in respect of Benue-Plateau State by section 3 of the Sharia Court of Appeal Law (Amendment) Edict 1970 of that State and in respect of North-Eastern State by section 3 of the Sharia Court of Appeal Law (Amendment) Edict 1970 of that State it is provided that the Sharia Court of Appeal shall consist of a Grand Kadi and not less than two other Judges learned in the Sharia :

AND WHEREAS by section 54 (3) of the Constitution of the former Northern Nigeria as modified by the Constitution (Suspension and Modification) Decree 1966, and of the States (Creation and Transitional Provisions) Decree 1967, it is provided that if the office of any Judge of the Sharia Court of Appeal other than the Grand Kadi is vacant or if the person holding the office is for any reason unable to perform the functions of his office, the Supreme Military Council, acting after consultation with the Advisory Judicial Committee, may appoint a person with such qualifications as may be prescribed by law to act in the office of a Judge of the Sharia Court of Appeal :

Now THEREFORE, THE SUPREME MILITARY COUNCIL, acting after consultation with the Advisory Judicial Committee, do hereby appoint BABA KURA IMAM to act as Deputy Grand Kadi of the Sharia Court of Appeal of Benue-Plateau State and of the Sharia Court of Appeal of North-Eastern State from 20th September 1971 whilst the Deputy Grand Kadi is acting for the Grand Kadi.
