The Supreme Military Council has, after considering the case of Mr Justice Ambrose Ezeolisa Allagoa, ordered that he be reinstated in the service of the Rivers State with effect from 1st November, 1971.

2. The Council further directs that the period commencing from 30th May, 1967 to the date of his reinstatement shall not be reckoned for purposes of seniority or retiring benefits.

#### Government Notice No. 1897

## Competition for Entry into the Administrative and Special Departmental Classes of the Western State of Nigeria Public Service, 1972

It is notified for the information of intending candidates that the competition for entry into the Administrative Class and the Special Departmental Classes of Auditors, Assistant Registrars of Co-operative Societies, Produce Officers and Inspectors of Taxes, all in Scale 'A' in the Western State of Nigeria Public Service will start in April 1972.

- 2. The competition comprises:
- (a) a qualifying written examination, conducted by the West African Examinations Council;
- (b) a series of tests and interviews, known as an Extended Interview, conducted by the Public Service Selection Board; and
- (c) an interview before the Public Service Commission.

  Only those candidates who attain the qualifying standard in the written examination will be invited for the tests and interviews to be conducted by the Public Service Selection Board. The Public Service Commissioners will subsequently select, in the light of candidates' performances at the Selection Board, those whom they will themselves interview.
- 3. To be eligible for admission to the competition, a candidate who is not already a serving officer in the Western State of Nigeria Public Service must hold a Degree from a recognised University, or alternatively in the case of the Special Departmental Classes of Auditors and Inspectors of Taxes, a recognised professional qualification, i.e. the Final Certificate or Associate Membership of any of the following Professional Bodies:
  - (i) Institute of Chartered Accountants;
  - (ii) Association of Certified and Corporate Accountants;
  - (iii) Institute of Cost and Works Accountants;
  - (iv) Institute of Municipal Treasurers and Accountants.

- Note.—(1) For the Special Departmental Classes of Assistant Registrars of Co-operative Societies, a degree in Economics is preferable and for the Class of Produce Officers, the degree must be either in Agriculture or Economics.
- (2) 'Recognised' in the above context means 'recognised by the Government of Western State of Nigeria'.
- 4. Candidates who are sitting for any of the above qualifications in 1972 will also be eligible for admission to the competition on the understanding that if they fail to secure the appropriate qualifications, they will automatically drop out of the competition.
- 5. The written examination will not be designed to test candidates on the subjects in which they hold degrees, but to test their ability to think clearly and to understand and write English and also their knowledge of current affairs, with particular reference to West African Affairs. Notes for the guidance of candidates drawn up by the West African Examinations Council will be issued to all candidates in due course. The Examination will comprise the following papers:
  - (i) English (Precis and Critical Appreciation).—This paper will consist of a precis of a passage supplemented by a question asking candidates to comment critically on the central idea of the passage.
  - (ii) Current Affairs.—This will be in two parts. Paper I will consist of three questions of the traditional Essay Type, all of which must be answered. Paper II, an objective test, will consist of fifty questions, all of which must also be answered. In both papers the range of questions will be such as will cater for the graduate, the University student as well as the non-graduate. The questions are intended to test the intelligent awareness of current affairs which any educated person may reasonably be presumed to possess.
  - (iii) General.—This will consist of two questions, one will test ability to detect dubious thinking, and will contain short passages, the Logical Force of which is to be discussed critically. The other will test ability to draw Statistical Inferences from a table of numerical data.

The written examination will be held in April 1972 in Lagos, Ibadan, Ife, Akure, Jos, London, Washington and at such other centres as may be determined later.

- 7. Minimum transport expense to and from London and Washington will be refunded to candidates who are in the British Isles or the United States of America respectively, who travel to and from those cities for the purpose of taking the written examination. In respect of attendance at the Public Service Selection Board, a detention allowance, subject to a maximum of two nights, will be paid to candidates who are neither serving officers nor resident in the city where the Board is held, to help them in defraying the cost of their accommodation and transport expenses in that city. A refund of minimum local transport expenses to and from the place of interview is also payable. In all cases candidates will be responsible for arranging their own accommodation and transport and meeting the cost in the first instance.
  - 8. Each candidate will be required to pay an examination fee of £5-5s-0d which is not refundable.
- 9. Serving officers are being informed of the special arrangements affecting them. Other candidates who have already applied on Form WSPSC. 1 for appointment to one or more of the classes mentioned in paragraph 1 above should, if in Nigeria, send to the Secretary, Public Service Commission, Ibadan, Treasury Receipt for the £5-5s-0d competition fee or, if outside Nigeria, send £5-5s-0d by Money Order or Postal Order, crossed in each case, to the authority to whom they addressed their applications on Form WSPSC. 1 under a covering letter referring to their applications. These must be received not later than Friday, 10th December, 1971. This Commission will not accept any responsibility for money sent in any other manner than that prescribed and late entries will not be entertained.
- 10. Candidates who have not yet applied but wish to do so should send the fee in the manner prescribed above, with their application on Form WSPSC. 1, to the Secretary, Public Service Commission, Ibadan, if they are in West Africa, or to the Chairman, London Selection Panel and Recruitment Attaché, Nigeria High Commission, 9 Northumberland Avenue, London, W.C. 2, if they are in Europe, or to the Head of Chancery, Embassy of Nigeria, 500 Dupont Circle Building, Washington 6, D.C., if they are in the United States of America or Canada. The applications and fees must be received not later than Friday, 10th December, 1971.
  - 11. Instructions as to the date, time and place of attendance will be sent direct to individual candidates.
- 12. #### COMPETITION FOR ENTRY INTO THE GENERAL EXECUTIVE CLASS IN THE PUBLIC SERVICE OF MID-WESTERN NIGERIA

The 1972 competition for entry into the General Executive Class in the Mid-Western Nigeria Public Service will begin in January 1972. The candidates who are successful in the competition will be appointed as Assistant Executive Officers-in-Training, Scale C(E) Training.

- 2. The competition will consist of:
- (a) A qualifying written examination conducted by the West African Examinations Council in
  - (i) English
  - (ii) Arithmetic and
  - (iii) General Paper:
- (b) An interview by the Public Service Commission.

Only candidates who attain the qualifying standard in the written examination will be invited for interview by the Public Service Commission.

- 3. Duties.—This is primarily a training grade, but an Assistant Executive Officer-in-Training will be required to undertake critical examination of particular cases not clearly within the scope of definite instructions; initial investigations into matters of higher importance and the making of proposals for action; finance, accounting, establishments and office organisation duties not within the scope of Clerical Officer; he may under the supervision of a senior officer, undertake the direction of small blocks of work.
  - 4. In order to be eligible to enter for the competition a candidate must possess either:
  - (a) the Higher School Certificate, obtained with a pass in three subjects at one sitting; or
  - (b) G.C.E. (A/L) in three papers at a sitting or four papers at not more than two sittings.
- 5. The purpose of the written examination is to test the candidates' ability to think clearly, to understand and write English as well as the candidates' knowledge of current affairs, particularly West African affairs. Notes for the guidance of candidates and instructions as to the date, time and place of attendance drawn up by the West African Examinations Council will be issued to all candidates in due course.
- 6. The written examination will be held in January 1972 in Benin City, Lagos, Ibadan and Zaria. Instructions as to the date, time and place of examination will be sent direct to candidates by the West African Examinations Council. The dates for the interview by the Public Service Commission will be announced later.
  - Candidates will be responsible for their transport expenses, feeding and accommodation.

- (g) Determining methods of observation and of interpreting the local climate with respect to the land, for subsequent use in control operations;
- (h) Visiting the various research and observational stations for the migratory locust, to ensure that they have meteorological instruments for making observations, both at fixed positions and with mobile instruments; also instructing the locust or specialized personnel in the maintenance of instruments and how to make observations.
