NOTICE BY THE BOARD OF CUSTOMS AND EXCISE

Customs and Excise Notice No. 30

IMPORTATION OF MOTOR VEHICLES—REVENUE CONTROL

Commencement : 6th December, 1971

PART I—GENERAL

1. *Definition.*—In this notice the term—

(a) "New Motor Vehicle" means one which has not been driven on the road other than for purposes of test or of delivery from the manufacturer to the port of shipment.

(b) "Used Motor Vehicle" means one which has been purchased new and used by the owner abroad or purchased second-hand, and subsequently imported.

2. *Declaration of Motor Vehicles.*—All Motor Vehicles imported by sea, land or air, be they new or used, whether accompanied or unaccompanied, are to be declared in the normal way, by the importer or his licensed Customs Agent on an entry in Form Sale 42 (Import Entry for Home Use)—

(a) Where a new motor vehicle is imported, Form Sale 42 is to be supported with the normal commercial invoices ;

(b) Where a used motor vehicle is imported, Form Sale 42 is to be supported with :

(i) Form Sale 46—Declaration for Import Duty on used motor Vehicle Imported by sea, land or air which must be suitably adapted, completed and signed by the importer himself (Annex 'A') ;

(ii) vehicle log book ; and

(iii) any other relevant papers capable of establishing the basic price and age of the vehicle.

(c) Where a motor vehicle is imported temporarily, the instructions contained in Customs and Excise Notice No. 14—Government Notice No. 982 of 1959 are to be complied with.

3. *Invoices.*—Invoices to be attached to Entries are described in paragraph 8 (a) (i), (ii) and (iii) of Customs and Excise Notice No. 13 published as Government Notice No. 1989 of 1970.4. *Basic Price.*—The basic price shall be the ex-factory price of the motor vehicle in the country of manufacture excluding such overhead expenses as :—

(a) pre-shipment freight or transport charges ;

(b) pre-shipment insurance charges ;

(c) local duties and taxes or fees in the country of origin ;

(d) expenses incurred in obtaining bond or security for such local duty, taxes, or fees ; and

(e) cost of Registration plates purchased abroad.

5. *Deductions from the basic price for age.*—Subject to the importer of a used motor vehicle producing documentary evidence in addition to Form Sale 46, to show that the motor vehicle had previously been licensed and put to use, the following deductions stated hereunder, shall be allowed from the basic price of such used motor vehicle based on its year of manufacture, and date of first registration :

	Percentage
(a) above 3 months with odometer reading above 3,000 miles but not above 1 year	10
(b) more than 1 year but not above 2 years	20
(c) more than 2 years but not above 3 years	30
(d) more than 3 years but not above 4 years	40
(e) above four years	50

6. *Value for Duty Purposes.*—The following charges shall be added to the basic price in respect of new vehicles and to the net value calculated as in paragraph 6 to ascertain the value for duty purposes—

(a) Ocean freight from the country of Manufacture ;

(b) Marine Insurance ;

(c) Incidental charges prior to shipment other than those listed in paragraph 5 ;

(d) Buying Commission.

7. *Additional Fittings.*—All additional fittings must be declared and duty paid thereon provided that an age allowance in accordance with paragraph 6 of this Notice shall be taken into consideration when assessing duty.

8. *Import licences.*—Licences, where required, must be produced before the authorisation for release shall be given.

9. *Certificates of payment or exemption from duty on Motor Vehicles.*—On completion of all Customs formalities, an importer of a motor vehicle shall be issued with one of the following certificates :—

(a) *Certificate of payment of duty on a Motor Vehicle—Book C.50 : (Annex 'B')*—This certificate is issued in quadruplicate in respect of every motor vehicle on which duty has been paid. The first three copies of the said certificate is handed over to the importer who is to submit three copies of the certificate to the Motor Registration/Licensing Authority with an application for a motor vehicle licence, or

(b) *Certificate of exemption from payment of duty on a Motor Vehicle—Book C.51 (Annex 'C')*—This certificate is prepared in quadruplicate in Book C.51 in respect of :

(i) A motor vehicle imported without payment of duty under specific provisions in the Tariff; and

(ii) for a motor vehicle purchased by privileged person or body from the duty paid stock of an agent in Nigeria with the prior approval in writing of the Board, provided the Agent surrenders to the Board the certificate in Book C.50 issued at the time of importation of the vehicle;

(iii) In the case where a vehicle is purchased from the duty-paid stock of an agent by a diplomat, the certificate shall be issued by the proper Area Chief Collector at the time such Collector approves Form C. 111 (Request for Customs Clearance of vehicles for the Diplomatic Corps/Technical Assistant Personnel in Nigeria);

(iv) In the case of purchase of a vehicle from duty-paid stock of an agent by a Technical Assistant Personnel, the certificate shall be issued at Headquarters by the Chief Collector, Privileged Importations and Trade Concessions (CC/PITC), after approving the purchase and the time of issue of the relevant vehicle Replacement Authorisation.

(c) The first three copies of the certificate in all cases are to be handed over to the person or body entitled to duty-free privileges who is to surrender them to the motor Registration/Licensing Authority with the application for a motor vehicle licence.

10. *Vehicle Licensing Authority.*—Vehicle Licensing Authorities are hereby warned not to register any vehicle unless such Licensing Authority is in possession of the certificate of Customs Clearance form C.50 or C.51 as the case may be.

11. *Disposal of copies of certificates.*—After issuing a licence to the motor vehicle owner, the Motor Licensing Authority shall endorse and sign the certificate and must forward the original to the proper Collector at the port or station of importation, retain the duplicate for reference purposes and hand over the third copy to the licensee.

PART II—DUTY-FREE CONCESSIONS ALLOWED TO PRIVILEGED PERSONS EXEMPTIONS FROM DUTY ON IMPORTATION

12. *Exemption from duty of Customs* applies only to direct importations or to delivery ex-bonded Warehouse, subject to any concession the Board in its discretion may grant in accordance with paragraph 14 hereunder.

13. *Conditions for the granting of the above concessions.*—The privileged person or body shall apply in writing on Form CC. III (Annex 'D', obtainable from the Ministry of External Affairs), to the Board of Customs and Excise, through the Chief of Protocol, Ministry of External Affairs in the case of the Diplomatic Corps or Mission and through the Ministry of Economic Development, in the case of Technical Assistant Personnel. The approved Form CC III shall accompany all documents required for Customs Entry.

14. *Vehicles obtained from dealers ex-duty paid stock.*—Such vehicles will be replaced by identical vehicles imported by the dealer within four months of the sale to the privileged buyer. Such replacement vehicles will be imported duty-free except that where the rate of duty has increased between the time of sale of the original vehicle and the time of importation of the replacement, the dealer shall be made liable for any such additional duty.

The Board may approve the application mentioned in paragraph 13, by a privileged person or body to purchase a motor vehicle from the Dealers' duty-paid stock subject to the following conditions appearing hereunder :—

(a) the motor vehicle dealer shall surrender the relevant Certificate of payment of duty on a Motor Vehicle (Book C.50) (see paragraph 9 (a) to the proper Collector of Customs for cancellation);

(b) the privileged person or body shall have applied for the issue of a Certificate of Exemption from payment of duty (Book C. 51) for the vehicle, thus placing such vehicle in the category of a duty-free importation;

(c) the dealer shall give an undertaking that he will pay any excess in duty which may result from any tariff changes at the time the replacement vehicle is imported and that no claim for refund of duty shall be made;

(d) the privileged person or body shall give an undertaking that the motor vehicle shall not be diverted to any other unprivileged use or purpose whatsoever without having first obtained the written permission of the Board.

**PART III—DISPOSAL OF MOTOR VEHICLES IMPORTED/PURCHASED FROM DUTY
PAID STOCK UNDER DIPLOMATIC AND ALLIED PRIVILEGES**

15. Sale to Federal Government :

(a) Under the provisions of items 23C and 23D of Schedule 2 to the Customs Tariff Act 1965, all vehicles imported under Diplomatic and Allied Privileges intended for disposal to the Federal Government shall be sold for a price approved by the Federal Government. Owners of such vehicles should contact the Federal Ministry of Trade, Bulk Purchasing Unit, Lagos, which has been approved as the purchasing Ministry for that purpose. The Federal Ministry of Trade, Lagos, has arranged with the Federal Ministry of Works and Housing, Lagos to determine the duty-free value at which the Ministry shall purchase such vehicles from such privileged persons or bodies concerned.

(b) It shall be the duty of the Federal Ministry of Trade, Lagos to forward the particulars of all vehicles purchased, to the Chief Inspector of Customs and Excise, Inspectorate Branch, Yaba on a pro-forma attached to this Notice as Annex 'E'. The particulars to be forwarded shall include Customs Form C.51 (Certificate of Exemption from payment of Duty), which must be recovered from the privileged user at the time of purchase.

(c) The Chief Inspector shall :—

(i) assess the duty that shall be payable on the vehicle by the ultimate purchaser and shall advise the Federal Ministry of Trade of this amount on the pro-forma attached to this Notice as Annex 'F' ;

(ii) retain in the Inspectorate Branch, the Customs Form C.51 recovered from the privileged user in respect of the said vehicle.

(d) It shall be the responsibility of the Federal Ministry of Trade, Lagos to :—

(i) provide for the storage of all vehicles purchased and make arrangements for the prompt disposal of such vehicles to Government Departments, Government Officials or members of the public ;

(ii) pay any monies received as import duties (as advised by the Chief Inspector) at any Customs House ;

(iii) furnish the Chief Inspector with the full particulars of the relevant Customs Receipt.

(e) The proper Officer of Customs and Excise shall issue a Certificate of Payment of Duty (Form C.50) in respect of the vehicle in the name of the purchaser as supplied by the Federal Ministry of Trade at the time the duty is paid by the said Ministry.

(f) In the case where there is a disagreement as to the valuation of a vehicle and the owner of such vehicle has elected to re-export the said vehicle, the Federal Ministry of Trade shall immediately inform the Chief Inspector, who shall, on receipt of such information, request the privileged person or body as the case may be, to make immediate arrangement for and produce evidence of exportation of the vehicle or pay the duty involved.

16. Transfer between Privileged persons or bodies :

(a) (i) In the case where a privileged person or body being a diplomat or Diplomatic mission, wishes to transfer a vehicle imported or purchased on a duty-free concession to another person or body also entitled to duty-free concession, the approval in writing of the Chief of Protocol, Ministry of External Affairs must first be obtained ;

(ii) In the case where the transfer is by a Technical Assistant personnel, the approval in writing of the Permanent Secretary, Ministry of Economic Development and Reconstruction must first be obtained.

(b) The privileged person or body should after obtaining permission, thereafter apply to the Board in writing for permission to effect the transfer. Such application, addressed to the Chief Collector, Privileged Importation and Trade Concessions, Harvey Road, Yaba, should be supported with a copy of the approval from the Ministry of External Affairs or Economic Development as the case may be, and the Form C.51 previously issued to the privileged person or body at the time the vehicle in question was imported or purchased. On approval of the application, the transferee will be issued with a new Form C.51.

17. Technical Assistance Personnel :

(a) It is strictly forbidden for motor vehicles imported or purchased locally by Technical Assistance Experts on duty-free concession basis to be sold within three years of the owners arrival in Nigeria except in exceptional circumstances, and with the prior written approval of the Ministry of Economic Development and Reconstruction.

(b) A Technical Assistance Personnel shall at all times be held responsible for the purchased vehicle until it shall have been properly disposed of in accordance with paragraphs 16 and 17 of this Notice.

18. (a) Unlawful Removal of Parts.—It shall be an offence punishable under the Customs and Excise Management Act for anyone to remove any part or parts of a conditionally exempted vehicle for the purpose of cannibalising other vehicles.

(b) *Liability*.—Any person who, without the permission of the Board, deals with, transfers or takes over ownership of a conditionally duty-free motor vehicle shall be guilty of an offence, and shall be liable under section 41 of the Customs and Excise Management Act No. 55 of 1958 to the following penalties :

- (i) a fine of two hundred pounds or six times the value of the motor vehicle whichever is the greater ; and
- (ii) forfeiture of the said motor vehicle.

Notes :

1. This Notice supersedes Customs and Excise Notices Nos. 30 and 40 published as Government Notices Nos. 216 of 1965 and 2344 of 1963 respectively and covers :—

- (a) the procedure for the revenue control of motor vehicles imported into Nigeria by sea, land and air ;
- (b) motor vehicles imported or bought locally from the duty-paid stock of an agent in Nigeria by privileged persons or bodies, and the subsequent disposal of such motor vehicles by—
 - (i) sale to Federal Government ;
 - (ii) transfer to a privileged person/body ; and
- (c) temporarily imported vehicles.

2. Specimens of Sale Forms mentioned in this Notice may be seen at any Custom House and may be printed privately provided they conform with the said specimens in size, colour and ink impression.

3. Attention of importers and those concerned is drawn to sections 17 and 41 of the Customs and Excise Management Act, No. 55 of 1958 which gives the Board authority to control the movement of uncleared goods, etc.

4. All annexes attached to this Notice shall be read with and form part of the Notice.

5. Importers are to note that the Age Allowance for used motor vehicles has been reduced from nine to five years.

6. All Licensing Authorities should note that under no circumstances should they register any vehicle without evidence of duty having been paid on such vehicle. A contravention of this may lead to prosecution and punishment (which may include forfeiture) under the Customs and Excise Management Act.
