

Two-year (Day) or (Evening) course leading to the award of a Proficiency Certificate in Russian Language. The Proficiency Certificate is not to be regarded as a teaching qualification.

- (iv) SCHOOL OF AFRICAN AND ASIAN STUDIES:
  - (a) Diploma Course in Yoruba Studies:
  - (b) Diploma Course in Edo Studies:

One-year (Day) Diploma Courses. Each is an introductory course in the relevant Language, Literature and Culture, designed for authors, broadcasters and other users of the language.
