### THE CONSTITUTION OF THE FORMER EASTERN NIGERIA

As modified by the Constitution (Suspension and Modification) Decree 1966 and the States (Creation and Transitional Provisions) Decree 1967



By His Excellency General Yakunu Gowon, Head of the Federal Military Government, Commander-in-Chief of the Armed Forces of the Federal Republic of Nigeria.

GENERAL Y. GOWON, Head of the Federal Military Government, Commander-in-Chief of the Armed Forces

Whereas by section 52 (2) of the Constitution of the former Eastern Nigeria as modified by the Constitution (Suspension and Modification) Decree 1966 and the States (Creation and Transitional Provisions) Decree 1967 it is provided that a person holding or appointed to act in the office of a judge of the High Court may be removed from his office or appointment by the Supreme Military Council, acting after consultation with the Advisory Judicial Committee.

Now THEREFORE, THE SUPREME MILITARY COUNCIL, acting after consultation with the Advisory Judicial Committee, do hereby remove Peter Effiong Odo Bassey from his office as a Judge of the High Court of the South-Eastern State with effect from 17th February 1972.
