THE CONSTITUTION OF THE FEDERATION

As modified by the Constitution Suspension and Modification Decree 1966



By His Excellency General YAKUBU Gowon, Head of the Federal Military Government, Commander-in-Chief of the Armed Forces of the Federal Republic of Nigeria.

GENERAL Y. GOWON, Head of the Federal Military Government, Commander-in-Chief of the Armed Forces

Whereas by section 111 (2) of the Constitution of the Federation as modified by the Constitution (Suspension and Modification) Decree 1966 it is provided that the Judges of the Supreme Court of Nigeria shall be the Chief Justice of Nigeria and such number of Justices of the Supreme Court (not being less than five) as may be prescribed by law:

AND WHEREAS by section 112 (1A) of the Constitution of the Federation as modified by the Constitution (Suspension and Modification) Decree 1966 and the Constitution (Amendment) Decree 1972, it is provided that the Justices of the Supreme Court shall be appointed by the Supreme Military Council, acting after consultation with the Advisory Judicial Committee:

Now THEREFORE, THE SUPREME MILITARY COUNCIL, acting after consultation with the Advisory Judicial Committee, do hereby appoint Mr Justice George Sodeinde Sowemimo as a Justice of the Supreme Court with effect from 15th April 1972.
