Central Bank of Nigeria Act (Cap. 30)

CENTRAL BANK OF NIGERIA (CREDIT POLICY FOR 1972-73) DIRECTIONS 1972

In exercise of the powers conferred by section 40 of the Central Bank of Nigeria Act, 1958, the following directions issued by the Central Bank of Nigeria to all commercial banks on 30th March, 1972 are hereby published for general information, that is—

To ALL COMMERCIAL BANKS

For the period 1st April, 1972 to 31st March, 1973, the following credit policy guidelines will be observed :—

1. Commercial banks are hereby directed to channel their loans and advances to the various sectors of the economy in such a way that by the end of fiscal year 1972-73, the proportion of their credit shall be as follows :—

2. Under the previous guidelines, banks were directed to allocate a minimum of 35 per cent of their total loans and advances to Nigerian businesses. This is now raised to a minimum of 40 per cent effective from 1st April, 1972. "Nigerian businesses" is defined to mean those businesses that are owned fifty-one to one hundred per cent by Nigerian persons.

3. While the Liquid Assets Ratio shall remain at 25 per cent, it is further directed that, under the provisions of section 40 (1b) of Central Bank of Nigeria Act 1958 (Cap. 30), (as amended 1962-69) each bank's minimum holding of treasury bills and certificates shall together be not less than 40 per cent of its total holdings of the specified liquid assets during fiscal 1972-73.

4. With the suspension of credit ceilings as a tool of credit control, the Central Bank will henceforth employ the cash reserve requirement. The cash reserve requirement will be instituted during the year as and when developments in the economy warrant monetary restraint. Preparatory to the institution of the cash reserve requirement, and in accordance with the provision of the Central Bank of Nigeria Act, section 40 (2-3) :-

(a) Banks have been divided into the following three categories, namely, A, B and C, and YOUR BANK HAS BEEN CLASSIFIED UNDER CATEGORY.....

(b) Each bank shall submit returns to the Central Bank showing its position as of every 15th day of each month—and if the 15th falls on a non-working day, then on the succeeding working day—in respect of

1. Total credit outstanding
 - (a) loans and advances
 - (b) investments
2. Total deposit liabilities of which demand deposits
3. Total liquid assets of which vault cash

5. The report shall reach the Research Department of the Central Bank within five (5) days of the reporting date.

4. Any public officer who receives a verbal objection in the course of his duty shall record name and address, interest and grounds of objection, and shall forward such details to the Permanent Secretary, Ministry of Works, Lands and Housing (Lands Division), Port Harcourt.

5. Matters relating to the amount of compensation payable by the aforesaid Company for its use of the land affected shall not be material grounds to include in a notice of objection.

6. The Permanent Secretary, Ministry of Works, Lands and Housing (Lands Division), shall enquire into the objections (if any) duly lodged in accordance with paragraphs 3 and 4 of the above at his office at Port Harcourt at 10 a.m. on the 6th day of November, 1972 giving all parties an opportunity to be heard. The results thereof shall be sent without delay to the Director of Petroleum Resources, Federal Ministry of Mines and Power, Lagos.

7. Compensation (if any) payable by the aforesaid Company for its use of the land affected, shall be determined by negotiation between the Company and the land owners and/or occupiers.
