Whereas by section 52 (2) of the Constitution of the former Western Nigeria as modified by the Constitution (Suspension and Modification) Decree 1966 and the States (Creation and Transitional Provisions) Decree 1967 it is provided that the Judges of the Court of Appeal of the State shall be the President of the Court of Appeal and such number of Justices of Appeal (not being less than three) as may be prescribed by law:

AND WHEREAS by section 52 (4) of the Constitution of the former Western Nigeria modified as aforesaid it is provided that the President of the Court of Appeal of the State and the Justices of Appeal shall be appointed by the Supreme Military Council, acting after consultation with the Advisory Judicial Committee;

Now, THEREFORE, THE SUPREME MILITARY COUNCIL, acting after consultation with the Advisory Judicial Committee, do hereby appoint Mr Justice Charles Olusoji Madarikan as the President of the Court of Appeal of Western State with effect from the 28th day of April, 1972.

AND WHEREAS by section 52 (7) of the Constitution of the former Western Nigeria modified as aforesaid it is provided that if the office of any Justice of Appeal is vacant or if the person holding the office is acting as President of the Court of Appeal of the State or is for any reason unable to perform the functions of the office, then, until a person has been appointed to and has assumed the functions, as the case may be, those functions shall be performed by such person, qualified to hold the office of Justice of Appeal to act in the office of Justice of Appeal, as may from time to time be designated in that behalf by the Supreme Military Council, acting after consultation with the Advisory Judicial Committee:

Now, Therefore, the Supreme Military Council, acting after consultation with the Advisory Judicial Committee, do hereby appoint Mr Justice Emmanuel Olawuyi Fakayode to act as a Justice of Appeal of the Court of Appeal of Western State with effect from 11th September, 1972.

Whereas by section 50 (2) of the Constitution of the former Eastern Nigeria as modified by the Constitution (Suspension and Modification) Decree 1966 and the States (Creation and Transitional Provisions) Decree 1967 it is provided that the High Court of the Rivers State shall consists of the Chief Justice and such number of other Judges (not being less than six) as may be prescribed by law:

AND WHEREAS by section 51 (3) of the Constitution of the former Eastern Nigeria as modified by the Constitution (Suspension and Modification) Decree 1966 and the States (Creation and Transitional Provisions) Decree 1967 it is provided that if the office of Chief Justice of the State is vacant or if the person holding the office is for any reason unable to perform the functions of his office, those functions shall be performed by such one of the other judges of the High Court of the State as may be designated in that behalf by the Supreme Military Council, acting after consultation with the Advisory Judicial Committee:

Now, THEREFORE, THE SUPREME MILITARY COUNCIL, acting after consultation with the Advisory Judicial Committee, do hereby appoint Mr JUSTICE AMBROSE EZEOLISA ALLAGOA to act as Chief Justice of the High Court of Rivers State from 18th September, 1972 to 23rd January, 1973 during the absence on vacation leave of the Chief Justice.

Whereas by section 50 (2) of the Constitution of the former Northern Nigeria as modified by the Constitution (Suspension and Modification) Decree 1966, the States (Creation and Transitional Provisions) Decree 1967 and the Constitution (Northern States) (Amendment) Decree 1969 it is provided that the Judges of the High Court of each of the States created out of the former Northern Nigeria shall be the Chief Justice and such number of other Judges (not being less than two) as may be prescribed by law:

AND WHEREAS by section 51 (6) of the said Constitution of the former Northern Nigeria modified as aforesaid it is provided that if the office of any Judge of the High Court other than the Chief Justice is vacant or if the person holding the office is acting as Chief Justice or is for any reason unable to perform the functions

of his office, the Supreme Military Council, acting after consultation with the Advisory Judicial Committee, may appoint a person with such qualifications as may be prescribed by law to act in the office of a Judge of the High Court:

Now, THEREFORE, THE SUPREME MILITARY COUNCIL, acting after consultation with the Advisory Judicial Committee, do hereby appoint EMMANUEL ADEYEMO ADEWUYI to act as a Judge of the High Court of Kwara State and of the High Court of North-Central State with effect from the 4th day of September, 1972, until further notice.

GENERAL Y. GOWON, Head of the Federal Military Government, Commander-in-Chief of the Armed Forces

Whereas by section 4 (1) of the Sharia Court of Appeal Law of the former Northern Nigeria as modified by the States (Creation and Transitional Provisions) Decree 1967 and as amended in respect of Kwara State by section 3 of the Sharia Court of Appeal Law (Amendment) Edict 1970 of that State and in respect of North-Central State by section 3 of the Sharia Court of Appeal Law (Amendment) Edict 1970 of that State it is provided that the Sharia Court of Appeal shall consist of a Grand Kadi and not less than two other Judges learned in the Sharia:

AND WHEREAS by section 54 (3) of the Constitution of the former Northern Nigeria as modified by the Constitution (Suspension and Modification) Decree 1966, and the States (Creation and Transitional Provisions) Decree 1967, it is provided that if the office of any Judge of the Sharia Court of Appeal other than the Grand Kadi is vacant or if the person holding the office is for any reason unable to perform the functions of his office, the Supreme Military Council, acting after consultation with the Advisory Judicial Committee, may appoint a person with such qualifications as may be prescribed by law to act in the office of a Judge of the Sharia Court of Appeal:

Now, THEREFORE, THE SUPREME MILITARY COUNCIL, acting after consultation with the Advisory Judicial Committee, do hereby appoint ABDUL KADIR ORIRE to act as Deputy Grand Kadi of the Sharia Court of Appeal of Kwara State and of the Sharia Court of Appeal of North-Central State from 4th September, 1972 to 16th November, 1972.

The purpose of declaring the public holidays is to enable Muslems to attend to their Religious and traditional obligations on these dates. It is therefore found necessary to alter the dates previously declared and announced,

Monday 6th and Tuesday 7th November, 1972 are now declared as public holidays throughout the country in observance of Id-El-Fitr. Wednesday 8th and Thursday 9th previously announced will no longer be observed as public holidays. Any inconvenience which this change may cause is deeply regretted.
