There is also at Farnham House a Systems Group of 13 under a Systems Manager who is responsible for the mechanization of CAB's services by the introduction of computer techniques.

The budget for the current quinquennium averages approximately £11m. per amum. Nearly two-thirds of the revenue comes from direct grants from Member Governments and the balance mainly from the sale of publications.

The Executive Council, comprising one representative from each of the 25-Member Governments and one representative of the remaining dependent territories, is solely responsible for CAB. The Secretary is responsible to the Council for administration and finance generally, and is the channel for all communications from Directors of Institutes and Bureaux and from the Systems Manager, who are responsible for the scientific and technical activities of their respective units. These responsibilities are to the collective Council and not to any one Government or to any Department of a Government. Routine administration is centralized as much as possible at headquarters in order to leave the scientific and technical staff free to concentrate on the major task of collecting and disseminating scientific information, and administration presents special problems owing to the high degree of CAB's decentralization. CAB's growing involvement in international activi-ties in the field of information science has also added a new and complex dimension to these problems.
