WHEREAS by section 48 (2) of the Constitution of the former Western Nigeria as modified by the Constitution (Suspension and Modification) Decree 1966 and the States (Creation and Transitional Provisions) Decree 1967 it is provided that the Judges of the High Court of Western State shall be the Chief Justice of Western State and such number of other Judges (not being less than six) as may be prescribed by law :

AND WHEREAS by section 49 (3) of the Constitution of the former Western Nigeria as modified by the Constitution (Suspension and Modification) Decree and as amended by the Constitution of the Western State (Amendment) Decree 1970 it is provided that if the office of Chief Justice of the State is vacant or if the person holding the office is unable to perform the functions of his office, then, until a person has been appointed to and has assumed the functions of that office or until the person holding the office has assumed those functions, as the case may be, those functions shall be performed by such one of the Justices of the Court of Appeal of the State or of the other Judges of the High Court of the State as may from time to time be designated in that behalf by the Supreme Military Council, acting after consultation with the Advisory Judicial Committee :

NOW, THEREFORE, THE SUPREME MILITARY COUNCIL, acting after consultation with the Advisory Judicial Committee, do hereby appoint MR JUSTICE EDWARD ADEGBOYEGA ADEMOLA to act as Chief Justice of the High Court of Western State from 1st November, 1972 to 30th November, 1972.

WHEREAS by section 48 (2) of the Constitution of the former Western Nigeria as modified by the Constitution (Suspension and Modification) Decree 1966 and the States (Creation and Transitional Provisions) Decree 1967 it is provided that the Judges of the High Court of Western State shall be the Chief Justice of Western State and such number of other Judges (not being less than six) as may be prescribed by law :

AND WHEREAS by section 49 (4) of the Constitution of the former Western Nigeria as modified by the Constitution (Suspension and Modification) Decree 1966 and the States (Creation and Transitional Provisions) Decree 1967 it is provided that if the office of any Judge of the High Court of the State other than the Chief Justice is vacant or if the person holding the office is acting as Chief Justice or is for any reason unable to

perform the functions of his office, the Supreme Military Council, acting after consultation with the Advisory Judicial Committee, may appoint a person with such qualifications as may be prescribed by law to act in the office of a Judge of the High Court and any person so appointed shall continue to act for the period of his appointment or if no period is specified until his appointment is revoked by the Supreme Military Council, acting after consultation with the Advisory Judicial Committee.

NOW, THEREFORE, THE SUPREME MILITARY COUNCIL, acting after consultation with the Advisory Judicial Committee, do hereby appoint LADIPO EMMANUEL VICTOR ADESANYA to act as a Judge of the High Court of Western State as from 28th November, 1972.

(vii) Any other acceptable Technical or Commercial qualification.

Candidates should also have a minimum of two years' professional, industrial or teaching experience.

**(b) NIGERIAN CERTIFICATE IN EDUCATION:**

This course leads to the award of either (i) the Nigerian Certificate in Education (Technical) or (ii) the Nigerian Certificate in Education (Commerce).

The course prepares candidates for teaching either technical subjects such as Woodwork, Metalwork and Technical Drawing, or Commercial subjects such as Commerce, Accounts, Shorthand and Typing, in Secondary Schools.

The duration of the course is a minimum of three years for holders of the West African School Certificate or equivalent qualifications and a minimum of four years for holders of the Intermediate or Ordinary Craft Certificate of City and Guilds.

(i) Candidates for the N.C.E. (Technical) must possess the West African School Certificate or equivalent qualification with credits in at least four subjects including English, Mathematics and a relevant science subject (such as Physics, Chemistry, Physics-with-Chemistry or Additional General Science) or the Intermediate or Ordinary Craft Certificate of City and Guilds in a major Engineering or Building Craft.

(ii) Candidates for the N.C.E. (Commerce) must possess the West African School Certificate or equivalent qualification with credits in at least four subjects including English Language and a commercial subject.
