**REFUTATION OF EDITORIAL COMMENT
IN DAILY SKETCH**

The attention of the Nigerian Enterprises Promotion Board has been drawn to an editorial comment in the *Daily Sketch* of Thursday, 5th April, 1973, in which it was implied that the Federal Military Government "would buy up any business the Nigerian public failed to acquire by 31st March, 1974". The Board wishes to inform the general public that no such decision has been taken by Government.

2. As far as possible, it is the intention of the Nigerian Enterprises Promotion Board to allow market forces to determine the transfer to Nigerians of enterprises listed in Schedule I or the stipulated indigenous participation in respect of business mentioned in Schedule II of the Decree. In the circumstances, it is obviously the responsibility of owners of enterprises affected by the Decree to take necessary measures to find buyers for their businesses even though the Secretariat of the Nigerian Enterprises Promotion Board is ready to assist in connecting prospective sellers with prospective buyers.

3. It is therefore imprudent for any proprietor of an enterprise affected by the Decree to sit back in the belief and hope that some public organisation would emerge at D-day, that is to say by 31st March, 1974, to buy up the enterprise in fulfilment of the provision of the Decree.

4. While the Board is determined to offer all possible assistance to prospective indigenous buyers in the implementation of the Decree it is not the business of the Board to interfere in the sales or transfers of businesses before 1st April, 1974, when the Board is empowered to take over, sell or otherwise dispose of any enterprise owned or partly owned by any alien who has failed to comply with the Decree by that day.
