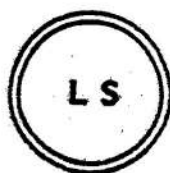

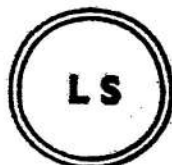

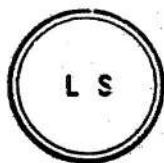

WHEREAS by section 4 (1) of the Sharia Court of Appeal Law of the former Northern Nigeria as modified by the States (Creation and Transitional Provisions) Decree 1967 and as amended in respect of Kwara State by section 3 of the Sharia Court of Appeal Law (Amendment) Edict 1970 of that State and in respect of North-Central State by section 3 of the Sharia Court of Appeal Law (Amendment) Edict 1970 of that State it is provided that the Sharia Court of Appeal shall consist of a Grand Kadi and not less than two other Judges learned in the Sharia :

AND WHEREAS by section 54 (1) of the Constitution of the former Northern Nigeria as modified by the Constitution (Suspension and Modification) Decree 1966 and the States (Creation and Transitional Provisions) Decree 1967, it is provided that the Grand Kadi and the other Judges of the Sharia Court of Appeal shall be appointed by the Supreme Military Council, acting after consultation with the Advisory Judicial Committee :

NOW, THEREFORE, THE SUPREME MILITARY COUNCIL, acting after consultation with the Advisory Judicial Committee, do hereby appoint MUHAMMADU DODO a Judge of the Sharia Court of Appeal of Kwara State and of North-Central State with effect from 1st day of April, 1973.
