In addition, if the staff member's services are terminated after at least one year of service for reasons other than serious misconduct, a termination indemnity varying in amount with the length of service rendered will be paid by the Organization; in certain cases the payment of this indemnity is discretionary and it is not paid in case of retirement or resignation.

INSTITUTE OF CHARTERED ACCOUNTANTS OF NIGERIA

RESOLUTIONS PASSED AT THE 8TH ANNUAL GENERAL MEETING OF THE INSTITUTE HELD ON 25TH MAY, 1973

Consequent to the promulgation of the Institute of Chartered Accountants (Amendment) Decree No. 30 of 1972, the 8th Annual General Meeting of the Institute held on 25th May, 1963 passed the resolutions to amend and/or confirm Rules 2, 12 and 13 of the Institute's Rules and Regulations. The Rules now stand as follows:

Recognised Qualifications for direct entry *Rule 2:* A member of any of the following professional bodies shall, at the discretion of the Council, be eligible for direct admission to membership of the Institute as a Chartered Accountant:

- (i) The Institute of Chartered Accountants in England and Wales.
- (ii) The Institute of Chartered Accountants of Scotland.
- (iii) The Institute of Chartered Accountants of Ireland.
- (iv) The Association of Certified & Corporate Accountants.
- (v) The American Institute of Certified Public Accountants.
- (vi) The Canadian Institute of Chartered Accountants.
- (vii) The Institute of Cost and Management Accountants.
- (viii) The Institute of Municipal Treasurers and Accountants.

Licence to practise *Rule 12:* No member shall practise as a Chartered Accountant or Registered Accountant as the case may be unless he had applied for and been granted a licence to practise by the Council. Such licence which shall be in the form approved by the Council from time to time shall be conspicuously displayed at the principal place of business of the member.

Eligibility for practising certificate *Rule 13:* No member shall be eligible for a licence to practise as a Chartered Accountant under Rule 12 unless he had for a continuous period of thirty months before or after or partly before and partly after becoming a member of the Institute been employed in a responsible accountancy position in the office of a qualified accountant in public practice in Nigeria or elsewhere;

Provided that any member who is entitled to a certificate to practise from a recognised body prior to 31st August, 1965, shall in any case be entitled to a certificate to practise;

Provided also that a "qualified accountant" for the purpose of this Rule means an accountant who is a member of the Institute or who would by virtue of his qualification be eligible for membership under Rule 2.
