FEDERAL MINISTRY OF EDUCATION

FEDERAL GOVERNMENT BURSARY SCHEME FOR THE TRAINING OF TEACHERS FOR POST-PRIMARY EDUCATIONAL INSTITUTIONS IN NIGERIA 1973-74

In pursuance of the Federal Government Policy that teachers in all types of Post-Primary Educational Institutions in the country should be well-qualified, applications for bursaries are invited from interested candidates, who have decided to take up Teaching as a career.

2. Bursaries are tenable at Advanced Teachers Training Colleges, Colleges of Education and Universities in Nigeria. At present, the value of a bursary covers tuition fees, boarding charges and where applicable, teaching practice fees.

- 3. Qualifications.—Candidates must be either students already studying in the Institutions or students who have already obtained admission into any of the institutions mentioned below.
- 4. Method of application.—Application forms which should be completed in duplicate are obtainable from any of the following institutions :-
 - (a) Advanced Teachers' Colleges in Nigeria and National Teachers' Technical College, Yaba;
 - (b) Colleges of Education in Nigeria:
 - (c) Local Universities.
- 5. Sponsorship.—Every application must sponsored by a State Government of the applicant's own choice. The Federal Ministry of Education does not look for State-Sponsorship for APPLICANTS.
- 6. Time schedule for submission of forms.—(a) Forms should be submitted by applicants to States of their choice for sponsorship not later than 29th September, 1973.
- (b) State Ministries of Education should submit all forms to the Teacher Training Section of the Federal Ministry of Education not later than 27th October, 1973. Envelopes containing application forms must be clearly marked "Teachers Bursaries" and sent by Registered post.
- (c) Interested candidates are strongly advised to obtain their application forms from the particular institutions where they have been offered admissions or where they are already pursuing their courses.
- 7. The Federal Ministry of Education will NOT accept any application direct from any individual. Late application forms will not be considered by the Federal Ministry of Education.

APPENDIX

Summary of Benefits Additional to Salary
Available to Holders of Non-Career Appointments
(AMOUNTS QUOTED ARE IN US DOLLARS)

- 1. Dependency allowance.—\$400 per annum for a spouse and \$300 per annum for each child provided those concerned qualify as being financially dependent upon the staff member. If the allowance in respect of a spouse is not paid a dependency allowance at the rate of \$200 per annum may be paid in respect of a parent or a brother or sister, subject to the same condition of financial dependency upon the staff member.
- 2. Education grant.—Under certain conditions an education grant is paid up to a maximum of \$1,000; per child annually, as well as expenditure on children's education travel to and from the home country or other permissible place of education.
- 3. Pension fund.—The staff member will become a full participant in the United Nations Joint Staff Pension Fund, which involves a contribution by the staff member of 7 per cent of his pensionable remuneration (presently established at 105 per cent of the gross salary) with the Organization contributing 14 per cent. The staff member's contribution plus accrued interest will be refunded to him on termination of his contract.
- 4. Compensation for service incurred Death, injury or illness.—The Organization pays compensation for death, injury or illness attributable to the performance of official duties, in accordance with established rules.
- 5. Life and Medical insurance.—A group life insurance and a group medical insurance plan can be joined by the staff member.
 - 6. Sick leave. Adequate sick leave is granted.
- 7. Annual leave.—Six weeks annual leave accrue each year.
- 8. Travel and related expenses on appointment.—
 The Organization meets the cost of travel expenses of the staff member and his recognized dependents from his home to the duty station, and in addition pays reasonable costs of removal of furniture and personal effects. Alternatively the Organization may decide to pay an assignment allowance in lieu of removal of furniture and personal effects. Also payable is an installation grant, varying in amount according to the location of the duty station and the number of dependents of the staff member, to compensate for expenses normally incurred in initially settling in at the duty station.

INSTITUTE OF CHARTERED ACCOUNTANTS OF NIGERIA

RESOLUTIONS PASSED AT THE 8th ANNUAL GENERAL MEETING OF THE INSTITUTE HELD ON 25th MAY, 1973

Consequent to the promulgation of the Institute of Chartered Accountants (Amendment) Decree No. 30 of 1972, the 8th Annual General Meeting of the Institute held on 25th May, 1963 passed the resolutions to amend and/or confirm Rules 2, 12 and 13 of the Institute's Rules and Regulations. The Rules now stand as follows:

Recognised Qualifications for direct entry

Rule 2: A member of any of the following professional bodies shall, at the discretion of the Council, be eligible for direct admission to membership of the Institute as a Chartered Accountant:

- The Institute of Chartered Accountants in England and Wales.
- The Institute of Chartered Accountants of Scotland. The Institute of Chartered Accountants of Ireland. The Association of Certified & Corporate Accountants.
 The American Institute of Certified Public Accountants. (iv)
- (v) The Canadian Institute of Chartered Accountants. (vi)
- The Institute of Cost and Management Accountants. (vii) (viii) The Institute of Municipal Treasurers and Accountants.

Licence to practise

Rule 12: No member shall practise as a Chartered Accountant or Registered Accountant as the case may be unless he had applied for and been granted a licence to practise by the Council. Such licence which shall be in the form approved by the Council from time to time shall be conspicuously displayed at the principal place of business of the member.

Eligibility for practising certificate

Rule 13: No member shall be eligible for a licence to practise as a Chartered Accountant under Rule 12 unless he had for a continuous period of thirty months before or after or partly before and partly after becoming a member of the Institute been employed in a responsible accountancy position in the office of a qualified accountant in public practice in Nigeria or elsewhere;

Provided that any member who is entitled to a certificate to practise from a recognised body prior to 31st August, 1965, shall in any case be entitled to a certificate to practise;

Provided also that a "qualified accountant" for the purpose of this Rule means an accountant who is a member of the Institute or who would by virtue of his qualification be eligible for membership under Rule 2.
