SCHOLARSHIP AND BURSARY AWARDS
FOR 1974-75

(A) POST-GRADUATE SCHOLARSHIPS

(B) UNDERGRADUATE BURSARIES

(C) TECHNOLOGICAL/TECHNICAL BURSARIES

(i) Applications are invited from qualified candidates for the award of the above scholarships or bursaries to take effect from the beginning of the 1974-75 academic session.

(ii) *General information on applications.*—The general information for the above kinds of awards are set out below under paragraphs 2-8. The list of courses under each type of award is given at paragraph 9. Applicants are advised to limit their choices of courses from among those lists.

2. COURSES FOR AWARDS :

(i) Awards will be made for courses offered in Nigerian universities and other Nigerian institutions of higher learning at undergraduate, professional, technical and post-graduate levels.

(ii) Special consideration may be given for courses for which there are no facilities in local institutions and which are among the priority areas of the national manpower needs. Such courses, if awarded for, may be undertaken outside Nigeria.

(iii) In all cases courses for awards must be those deemed to be relevant to manpower needs of the country.

(iv) Awards for post-graduate studies will be for Masters degree initially except where someone already possesses a Masters degree or its equivalent.

3. QUALIFICATIONS :

A. POST-GRADUATES :

(i) Only those with a first degree or qualification, not lower than Second-class Lower division need to apply. (This does not apply to professional qualifications which are not graded into classes).

(ii) Courses applied for should be related to areas in which applicants obtained their basic qualifications.

(iii) Only candidates who have had two or more years of experience after their basic degree or basic qualification by the time awards are made to them will be considered.

(iv) Candidates who have been made offers of other awards for post-graduate studies such as the Commonwealth Scholarships, etc. will not be considered.

(v) Candidates who are employed must submit their applications through the heads of their departments or principals who must complete Section E of the application form.

B. UNDERGRADUATES/PROFESSIONAL :

(i) All applicants for undergraduate/professional awards must have good West African School Certificate (W.A.S.C.), General Certificate of Education Ordinary Level (G.C.E.—O/L) or Teachers Grade II Certificate.

(ii) For successful applicants to benefit from awards they should be qualified for university admission and pass at reasonable standard in subjects related to their courses.

(iii) Other higher qualifications may be advantageous but not necessary.

C. TECHNOLOGICAL/TECHNICAL :

(i) Applicants for awards in this category must have good W.A.S.C., G.C.E.—O/L, or Teachers Grade II, for those applying for Ordinary National Diploma/Certificate, O.N.D./O.N.C. or equivalent qualifications.

(ii) Those for the Higher National Diploma/Certificate, H.N.D./H.N.C., or equivalent qualifications, in addition to good W.A.S.C., G.C.E. O/L or Teachers Grade II, must have passed their O.N.D./O.N.C. with good grades.

4. ADMISSIONS :

(i) The arrangements for admission are the responsibility of those who are successful in their applications. Those who have applied for admission or are already on their courses in Nigerian institutions need to apply.

(ii) The securing of admission either locally or abroad is not a guarantee for an award. Also admission for study abroad will not be a basis for transferring an award made tenable locally to an overseas institution or from one country overseas to another.

(iii) Candidates are advised to make sure that they apply for courses for which they are qualified or are likely to be admitted. Applications for changes of courses after the awards have been made will not be granted.

5. DOCUMENTS TO BE SUBMITTED

A completed application form must be accompanied by the following documents :

(a) *All Candidates.*—(i) A photostat copy of Birth Certificate or statutory declaration of age, and any documentary evidence of change of name such as by marriage or otherwise.

(ii) A photostat copy of letter of admission (if already admitted).

(iii) A recent passport size photograph of applicant.

(b) *For Post-graduate Awards.*—(i) A photostat copy of first degree certificate or diploma qualification.

(ii) Candidates who have Masters degrees or other higher qualifications should also forward photostat copies of such certificates or qualifications.
