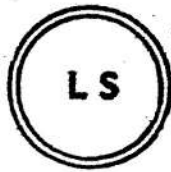

#### UNITED NATIONS DEVELOPMENT PROGRAMME "METEOROLOGICAL RESEARCH AND TRAINING INSTITUTE" IN THE REPUBLIC OF KOREA

The purpose of the project is to establish a Meteorological Research and Training Institute over a period of three years and nine months.



The Institute will have Divisions for Agrometeorology, Hydrometeorology, Physical Meteorology Forecasting Research, Training and a Library and Publications Division. It will also have an instruments workshop. Training courses will be carried out for all grades of personnel. The research will be concentrated on:

(a) Weather information and forecasts required for increasing agricultural productivity, frost warning and protection, and the reduction of evaporation.

(b) Hydrometeorology with particular emphasis on flood forecasting, the formulation of flood warning techniques, water conservation, irrigation and planning for hydroelectric power projects, bridges and dams.

(c) Typhoon forecasting and warnings and other forecasting problems.

(d) Numerical weather prediction methods applicable to Korea.

(e) Studies of atmospheric sciences including cloud physics and air pollution.

Research work will, wherever possible be carried out in co-operation with the various Institutes of the Office of Rural Development, the Korean Institute of Science and Technology, the Ministry of Construction, and the Universities.

The UNDP is providing, through WMO, 99 man-months of expert services in the following fields: synoptic meteorology, agricultural meteorology, meteorological instruments and hydrometeorology. Twelve fellowships of various duration are being made available to permit certain of the national counterparts to study abroad.
