UNITED NATIONS DEVELOPMENT PROGRAMME

It will also have an instruments workshop. Training courses will be carried out for all grades of personnel. The research will be concentrated on:

(e) Studies of atmospheric sciences including cloud physics and air pollution.

Research work will, wherever possible be carried out in co-operation with the various Institutes of the Office of Rural Development, the Korean Institute of Science and Technology, the Ministry of Construction, and the Universities.

The UNDP is providing, through WMO, 99 man-months of expert services in the following fields: synoptic meteorology, agricultural meteorology, meteorological instruments and hydrometeorology. Twelve fellowships of various duration are being made available to permit certain of the national counterparts to study abroad. In addition, workshop and instrument calibration equipment, agro and hydrometeorological test equipment, a mobile meteorological station, an atmospheric sciences laboratory and demonstration and training equipment will be provided.
