3. At all material times the first Defendant was the driver, and the second Defendant the owner of motor vehicle No. LN 4914.

4. On the 18th July, 1967, along the road from Ikeja to Lagos known as Agege Motor Road, the first Defendant as the Servant or agent of the second Defendant, and in the course of his employment, drove the said vehicle so negligently that it collided with and damaged the motor car No. LK. 9914, the property of the Federal Government of Nigeria.

PARTICULARS OF NEGLIGENCE

- (a) Driving at an excessive speed ;
 - (b) Driving without due care having regard to the amount of traffic on the road ;
 - (c) Failing to have or keep any or proper control of the said vehicle No. LN 4914 ;
 - (d) Failing to stop, slow down or control the said vehicle so as to avoid hitting the Government vehicle from the rear ;
 - (e) Failing to leave sufficient braking distance.
5. By reason of the above premise the Government's said motor car was damaged beyond economical repair, and the Government thereby suffered loss.
