ADVANCED TRAINING IN METEOROLOGY IN THE ENGLISH-SPEAKING CARIBBEAN

The project "Advanced training in meteorology in the English-speaking Caribbean" has for its objective the following:

(i) To provide meteorological training at the Class I level at the Caribbean Meteorological Institute, in association with the University of the West Indies, Cave Hill Campus, Barbados.

(ii) To expand the training facilities at the Institute by the provision of appropriate equipment and training aids.

(iii) To provide advanced meteorological training to counterpart personnel designated to serve as Class I instructors after the completion of the project.

The Caribbean Meteorological Institute mentioned under (i) above was established in Barbados during the period 1967-1972 under the UNDP/WHO

project "Improvement of Caribbean Meteorological Services". One of the primary functions of the Institute is to provide training for meteorological personnel of Classes II, III and IV. During the five-year period of the project approximately 210 persons from the different Caribbean countries received training in the Institute in various branches of meteorology.

The purpose of the present project is to extend the meteorological training facilities available to the Caribbean English-speaking countries in order to meet the requirements of university-level trained meteorologists (Class I) of the participating countries. Initially courses will be offered leading to a B.Sc. degree in meteorology and it is planned to introduce later courses to provide M.Sc. and higher degrees in meteorology. The training will be provided by the Institute in association with the University of West Indies in Barbados.

UNDP assistance to this project will include the services of a senior lecturer-cum-Project Manager and two other lecturers, three fellowships for studies abroad in advanced meteorology for the training of counterpart staff, and training aids and equipment.

Qualifications.—The candidate should have a University degree in Meteorology, Mathematics or Physics and at least ten years' experience in synoptic meteorology. He should be fully conversant with the requirements of aeronautical meteorology preferably through a period of work at the meteorological office at an international airport. He should also be familiar with the organizational aspects of a Meteorological Service. Good practical knowledge of the most common meteorological instruments will be an advantage.

Additional information.—The Meteorological Service of Nepal was established in 1966-67 with advice of a WMO expert. With the help of the WMO expert, a network of climatological, agrometeorological and a few synoptic stations has been set up and observer staff was trained. Aeronautical forecasting facilities have been created at Kathmandu Airport and forecasting staff trained. The new UNDP project constitutes an expansion of the assistance given until now in order to consolidate and expand the progress made so far. It will start in 1974 and continue through 1976. The network of meteorological stations will be expanded, the collection, processing and exchange of meteorological data will be improved and a radiosonde station will be established. In addition, the organizational structure of the Meteorological Service will be developed and meteorological staff trained.

Language.—An excellent knowledge of English is required.

Salary level.—Initial net salary equivalent of US \$22,497.00 per annum, plus allowances.
