#### STATEMENT ON APPOINTMENT AND REMOVAL OF AUDITORS

It has come to the notice of the Council of the Institute of Chartered Accountants of Nigeria that some company directors purport to appoint new auditors without first of all removing or obtaining the resignation of the previous auditors in accordance with the provisions of the Companies Decree 1968.

The Council therefore wishes to point out to the business community that there are statutory provisions in the Decree concerning the appointment and removal of auditors. Auditors have certain rights, duties and responsibilities which they can neither abandon nor be relieved of by the directors of a company.

The appointment of new auditors, other than the retiring auditors, normally requires the passing of a Resolution at the Annual General Meeting of the Company. Notice of the nomination of new auditors should be given to the members of the Company not less than fourteen days before the date of the general meeting. Although directors have a right to appoint the first auditors before the Annual General Meeting and directors could also fill any casual vacancy in the office of auditor which may arise during the year, they cannot usurp the rights of members of the Company in the matter of appointment and/or removal of auditors at general meetings.

⁹The removal of the existing auditors should precede the appointment of new ones. Members of the Institute are aware of the standard of professional ethics expected in effecting a change. In all cases, the new auditors before accepting appointment, normally ask the out-going auditors if there are professional reasons why they should not accept the appointment. The outgoing auditors would not unreasonably withhold consent upon being asked by the incoming auditors.

It is important to note that a Special Notice must be given to shareholders of the company where the removal of existing auditors is contemplated. The outgoing auditors should be allowed ample opportunity to submit any representations they may wish to make to shareholders of the Company as provided in the Companies Decree. If the auditors elect to make representations to the company, new auditors should normally not be appointed until such representations have been heard and disposed of.

It is considered necessary to direct the attention of directors and shareholders to the fact that Section 154 of the Companies Decree 1968 subjects the investigation and audit of Companies to the provisions of the Institute of Chartered Accountants of Nigeria Act, 1965, which stipulates that only a member of the Institute who holds a practising licence to practise as an accountant may be appointed as the auditor of a company.

The same section excludes certain persons from being appointed as auditors of Companies. These are:

(a) an officer or servant of the Company; or

(b) a person who is a partner of or in employment of an officer or servant of the company; or

(c) a body corporate.
