WHEREAS by section 4 (1) of the Sharia Court of Appeal Law of the former Northern Nigeria as modified by the States (Creation and Transitional Provision) Decree 1966 and as amended in respect of Kano State section 3 of the Sharia Court of Appeal Law (Amendment) Edict 1970 of that State and in respect of North-Western State by section 3 of the Sharia Court of Appeal Law (Amendment) Edict 1970 of that State it is provided that the Sharia Court of Appeal shall consist of a Grand Kadi and not less than two other Judges learned in the Sharia :
