WHEREAS by section 4 (1) of the Sharia Court of Appeal Law of the former Northern Nigeria as modified by the States (Creation and Transitional Provisions) Decree 1967 it is provided that the Sharia Court of Appeal shall consist of a Grand Kadi, a Deputy Grand Kadi and three other Judges learned in the Sharia:

AND WHEREAS by section 54 (2) of the Constitution of the former Northern Nigeria as modified by the Constitution (Suspension and Modification) Decree 1966 and the States (Creation and Transitional Provisions) Decree 1967, it is provided that if the person holding the office of the Grand Kadi is for any reason unable to perform the functions of his office, those functions shall be performed by such one of the other Judges of the Sharia Court of Appeal as may from time to time be designated in that behalf by the Supreme Military Council, acting after consultation with the Advisory Judicial Committee:

Now, THEREFORE, THE SUPREME MILITARY COUNCIL, acting after consultation with the Advisory Judicial Committee, do hereby appoint Haliru Binji to act as Grand Kadi of the Sharia Court of Appeal of the Northern States with effect from 5th April, 1974.
