Description of duties.—1. The expert will be a member of an international team assigned to the National Transport Corporation's Training Centre in Mimosa, Lusaka. He will work under the direction of the project manager and will be required to co-operate closely with the other members of the team, consisting of experts in testing and selection and expert in commercial vehicle maintenance training.

- 2. As a member of the team whose duty is to assist the Government of Zambia in the development of training programmes for drivers, motor vehicle maintenance staff and other personnel for road transportation as specified in the project document, the expert will be responsible for:
 - (a) selection of instructors and development of instructor training basic and upgrading courses, including in-service training;
 - (b) preparation of course plans, syllabi and course material for training heavy commercial vehicle drivers, workshop personnel, as well as other staff needed for operation of a heavy truck fleet on international routes;

 - (f) evaluating training programmes in order to ascertain that the training delivered in the centre corresponds to the needs of the NTC and its subsidiaries and when necessary, preparing appropriate revision of training programmes;
 - (g) training of national counterpart staff in execution of the above duties;
 - (h) preparing and submitting to the project manager such reports on the above-mentioned activities as may be required;
 - (i) performing any other duties in connection with this assignment which are within his competence as a vocational training expert.

Qualifications required.—Sound general and technical education in the field of motor vehicle engineering; thorough training in modern methods of instuction in both workshop and classroom; experience in the use of modern training techniques, curricula development and planning and organisation of training programmes, particularly in developing countries; experience in driver training and the use of driving simulators; good working knowledge of English.
