AND WHEREAS by section 123 (1) of the Constitution of the Federation modified as aforesaid it is provided that the Chief Justice and other Judges of the High Court of Lagos State shall be appointed by the Supreme Military Council, acting after consultation with the Advisory Judicial Committee ;

AND WHEREAS the Advisory Judicial Committee has recommended that the said Mr Justice FATAI OTOLORIN DABIRI should be appointed a Judge of the High Court of Lagos State and that his service in Lagos State be treated as continuous with his service in the Public Service of the Western State ;

NOW, THEREFORE, THE SUPREME MILITARY COUNCIL, acting after consultation with the Advisory Judicial Committee, do hereby appoint Mr Justice FATAI OTOLORIN DABIRI as a Judge of the High Court of Lagos State with effect from 8th April, 1974, and hereby direct that his service in Lagos State be treated as continuous with his previous service in the Public Service of the Western State.
