WHEREAS by an Instrument dated 21st June, 1973 Mr FATAI OTOLORIN DABIRI was appointed as an acting Judge of the High Court of Western State with effect from 1st July, 1973;

AND WHEREAS by section 122 (2) of the Constitution of the Federation as modified by the Constitution (Suspension and Modification) Decree 1966 and the States (Creation and Transitional Provisions) Decree 1967 it is provided that the Judges of the High Court of Lagos State shall be a Chief Justice and such number of other Judges (not being less than five) as may be prescribed by law;

AND WHEREAS by section 123 (1) of the Constitution of the Federation modified as aforesaid it is provided that the Chief Justice and other Judges of the High Court of Lagos State shall be appointed by the Supreme Military Council, acting after consultation with the Advisory Judicial Committee:

AND WHEREAS the Advisory Judicial Committee has recommended that the said Mr Justice FATAI OTOLORIN DABIRI should be appointed a Judge of the High Court of Lagos State and that his service in Lagos State be treated as continuous with his service in the Public Service of the Western State;


Now, THEREFORE, THE SUPREME MILITARY COUNCIL, acting after consultation with the Advisory Judicial Committee, do hereby appoint Mr Justice FATAI OTOLORIN DABIRI as a Judge of the High Court of Lagos State with effect from 8th April, 1974, and hereby direct that his service in Lagos State be treated as continuous with his previous service in the Public Service of the Western State.

Whereas by an Instrument dated 20th June, 1968 Mr Candide Ademora Johnson was appointed a Judge of the High Court of the Western State with effect from 22nd April, 1968;

AND WHEREAS by section 122 (2) of the Constitution of the Federation as modified by the Constitution (Suspension and Modification) Decree 1966 and the States (Creation and Transitional Provisions) Decree 1967 it is provided that the Judges of the High Court of Lagos State shall be a Chief Justice and such number of other Judges (not being less than five) as may be prescribed by law:

AND WHEREAS by section 123 (1) of the Constitution of the Federation modified as aforesaid it is provided that the Chief Justice and other Judges of the High Court of Lagos State shall be appointed by the Supreme Military Council, acting after consultation with the Advisory Judicial Committee;

AND WHEREAS the Advisory Judicial Committee has recommended that the said Mr Justice CANDIDE ADEMOLA JOHNSON should be appointed a Judge of the High Court of Lagos State and that his service in Lagos State be treated as continuous with his service in the Public Service of the Western State;

Now, THEREFORE, THE SUPREME MILITARY COUNCIL, acting after consultation with the Advisory Judicial Committee, do hereby appoint Mr Justice Candide Ademola Johnson as a Judge of the High Court of Lagos State with effect from 8th April, 1974, and hereby direct that his new appointment be treated as continuous with his previous appointment as a Judge of the High Court of the Western State.
