FEDERAL WORKS REGISTRATION BOARD

NEW RULES FOR THE REGISTRATION RE-CLASSIFICATION OF CONTRACTORS

The Federal Works Registration Board registers Building, Civil Engineering, Mechanical and Electrical installations contractors who desire to be enrolled in the Federal Works Register for the purpose of tendering for Government contracts. The rules which have hitherto regulated the registration of contractors have now been revised, and are hereby notified for general information. As from 5th June, 1974, the following rules shall apply:—

- 1. A contractor who wishes to be registered on the Federal Works Register should apply to the Registrar, Federal Works Registration Board, Federal Ministry of Works and Housing, Lagos, for an application form. Upon receipt of the form, it should be duly completed and returned to the Registrar who will take necessary action to ensure that the application is brought to the attention of the Board which meets from time to time. A contractor who wishes to register with his business name should send with his application a photostat copy of his certificate of registration of trade with the Federal Ministry of Trade.
- 2. Every contractor applying to the Board for registration must also attach to the completed application form evidence of his technical competence and financial ability. For technical competence copies of contracts executed together with relevant completion certificates must be produced. Evidence of financial standing will consits of a bank statement or statements by other reputable institutions. In addition, a contractor who has never executed any government contract may, at some stage in the processing of his application, be required to attend an interview.
- 3. A contractor may be registered in any of the categories in column 1 below and the fees payable at the time of registration or re-classification are as shown in column 3:—

The registration fee is a once-for-all payment; but a contractor who applies to be re-classified in a higher category will, on re-classification, pay the registration fee applicable to the new category.

- 4. A contractor who wishes to be registered or re-classified in categories C and D should, in addition to producing evidence of technical competence and financial ability, show evidence that his permanent staff possess adequate and minimum technical qualifications and experience equivalent to those of an Assistant Technical Officer or an Assistant Works Superintendent in the Federal Ministry of Works and Housing.
- 5. Where a contractor is not himself technically qualified, he must submit evidence of the technical qualifications and experience of his permanent employees for scrutiny, in which case the category into which such a contractor will be registered shall be left to the discretion of the Board.
- All contractors applying for registration in any of the categories of the Mechanical/Electrical division shall produce evidence of a valid licence issued by the National Electric Power Authority (NEPA).
- 7. All contractors who are registered with the Board shall be required to submit annual returns of their permanent staff, complete with their qualifications and experience.
- 8. A contractor who fails to complete a government contract or whose workmanship or performance during the period of the contract has been the subject of complaint by a Supervising Officer may be required to give a written explanation to the Federal Works Registration Board which will consider each case on its merit and take appropriate disciplinary action which may include the removal of the contractor's name from the Register. Contractors who on their application forms give information subsequently found to be false will be disqualified.
- Appeals against the decision of the Federal Works Registration Board should be addressed to the Commissioner for Works and Housing through the Registrar to the Board.
