COMPETITION FOR ENTRY INTO THE
ADMINISTRATIVE AND SPECIAL DEPARTMENTAL
CLASSES OF THE WESTERN STATE OF NIGERIA
PUBLIC SERVICE, 1975

It is notified for the information of intending candidates that the competition for entry into the Administrative Class and the Special Departmental Classes of Auditors, Assistant Registrars of Co-operative Societies, Produce Officers and Inspectors of Taxes, all in Scale 'A' in the Western State of Nigeria Public Service will start in January 1975.

2. The Competition comprises:

(a) a qualifying written examination, conducted by the West African Examinations Council;

(b) a series of tests and interviews, known as an Extended Interview, conducted by the Public Service Selection Board; and

(c) an interview before the Public Service Commission.

Only those candidates who attain the qualifying standard in the written examination will be invited for the tests and interviews to be conducted by the Public Service Selection Board. The Public Service Commissioners will subsequently select, in the light of candidate's performance at the Selection Board, those whom they will themselves interview.

3. To be eligible for admission to the competition, a candidate who is not already a serving officer in the Western State of Nigeria Public Service must hold a Degree from a recognised University, or alternatively in the case of the Special Departmental Classes of Auditors, Accountants, and Inspectors of Taxes, a recognised professional qualification, i.e. the Final Certificate or Associate Membership of any of the following Professional Bodies :

- (i) Institute of Chartered Accountants ;
- (ii) Association of Certified and Corporate Accountants ;
- (iii) Institute of Cost and Management Accountants ;
- (iv) Institute of Municipal Treasurers and Accountants ;

Note.—(1) For the Special Departmental Class of Assistant Registrars of Co-operative Societies, a Degree in Economics is preferable and for the Class of Produce Officers, the Degree must be either in Agriculture or Economics.

(2) Candidates applying for the post of Auditor or Accountant who possess a good degree (either general with honours or distinction or special honours) in Accountancy or Economics as the major subject, of a recognised University or any of the qualifications listed in paragraph 3(i)–(iv) above are exempted from the Written Examination and the Extended Interview mentioned in paragraph 2(a) and (b) above, and need not pay the ₦12.00 fee mentioned in paragraph 6 below when submitting their applications. They will however be interviewed by the Public Service Commission.

(3) 'Recognised' in the above context means 'recognised by the Government of Western State of Nigeria'.

4. Candidates who are sitting for any of the above qualifications in 1975 will also be eligible for admission to the competition on the understanding that if they fail to secure the appropriate qualifications, they will automatically drop out of the competition. University undergraduates who have to serve for one year in the compulsory National Youth Service Corps can participate in the Competition but consideration for their appointment into any of the posts will, among other things, be subject to the production of a certificate of completion of service issued by the National Directorate of the Corps.

5. The Written Examination will not be designed to test candidates on the subjects in which they hold degrees, but to test their ability to think clearly and to understand and write English and, also, their knowledge of current affairs, with particular reference to West African Affairs.

(i) *English (Precis and Critical Appreciation).*—This paper will consist of a precis of a passage supplemented by a question asking candidates to comment critically on the central idea of the passage.

(ii) *Current Affairs.*—This will be in two parts. Paper I will consist of three questions of the traditional Essay type, all of which must be answered. Paper II, an objective test, will consist of fifty questions, all of which must also be answered. In both papers the range of questions will be such as will cater for the graduate, the university student as well as the non-graduate. The questions are intended to test the intelligent awareness of current affairs which any educated person may reasonably be presumed to possess.

(iii) *General.*—This will consist of two questions, one will test ability to detect dubious thinking and will contain short passages, the logical force of which is to be discussed critically. The other will test ability to draw statistical inferences from a table of numerical data.

6. The Written Examination will be held in January 1975 in Lagos, Ibadan, Ile-Ife, Akure, Jos, London, Washington and at such other centres as may be determined later. Each candidate will be required to pay an examination fee of ₦12.00 which is not refundable.

7. Serving Officers are being informed of the special arrangements affecting them. Other candidates who have already applied for Form WSPSC. 1 for appointment to one or more of the posts mentioned in paragraph 1 above should, if in Nigeria, send to the Secretary, Public Service Commission, Treasury Receipt for the ₦12.00 competition fee or, if outside Nigeria, send an equivalent of ₦12.00 by crossed Money Order or Postal Order to the authority to whom they addressed their applications on Form WSPSC. 1 under a covering letter referring to their applications. These must be received not later than *Friday, 13th September, 1974*. This Commission will not accept any responsibility for money sent in any other manner than that prescribed and late entries will not be entertained.

1. *Dependency benefit*

(a) US \$400 per annum for a dependent wife or dependent husband ;

(b) US \$300 per annum for each dependent child ;

(c) Where there is no dependent spouse, a single annual allowance of US \$200 for either a dependent parent, a dependent brother or a dependent sister.

2. *Education grant*†

An education grant is paid under certain conditions for children attending a school or university.

Leave

1. *Annual leave*

30 working days annually on full salary.

2. *Home leave*‡

Paid once every two years for the staff member expected to remain in the Organization's services for not less than two years and six months. This provision extends to spouse and children recognized as dependants by the Organization.

3. *Sick leave*

Staff members may under certain conditions be granted sick leave up to three months on full salary and three months on half salary in any period of twelve consecutive months.

Travel expenses§

Staff members' travel expenses are reimbursed upon appointment and separation. Travel expenses for dependants, spouse and children, may be reimbursed provided that the staff member's appointment is for one year or more.

For all travel by a staff member or persons of his family, the staff member must obtain the Secretary-General's prior authorization in writing.

Removal expenses are also reimbursed upon arrival and departure, provided that the appointment is for two years or more.

A daily installation grant is paid to staff members arriving to take up their posts in Geneva, as follows :

(i) Staff member accompanied by his family—30 days at 100 Swiss francs for the staff member and 30 days at 50 Swiss francs each dependant.

(ii) Staff member arriving unaccompanied—15 days at 100 Swiss francs.

(iii) When the spouse and children arrive after the staff member, they receive the grant under paragraph (i) and the staff member himself receives for 15 days, from the time of their arrival, the sum of 100 Swiss francs per diem in addition to the amount paid to him under paragraph (ii).

* These figures show the annual amounts for one class of post adjustment, Geneva being in class 8 since 1st January, 1974, the above amounts must be multiplied by 8.

† Two years of service are required for increments above and including step IV.

‡ Applicable only to staff members recruited outside the local area (Switzerland and French territory within 25 km of Geneva).

UNDP PROJECT

“ADVANCED TRAINING IN
METEOROLOGY IN THE ENGLISH-
SPEAKING CARIBBEAN”

The Project “Advanced training in meteorology in the English-speaking Caribbean” has for its objective the following :

(i) To provide meteorological training at the Class I level at the Caribbean Meteorological Institute, in association with the University of the West Indies, Cave Hill Campus, Barbados.

(ii) To expand the training facilities at the Institute by the provision of appropriate equipment and training aids;

(iii) To provide advanced meteorological training to counterpart personnel designated to serve as Class I instructors after the completion of the project.

The Caribbean Meteorological Institute mentioned under (i) above was established in Barbados during the period 1967-72 under the UNDP/WMO project “Improvement of Caribbean Meteorological Services”. One of the primary functions of the Institute is to provide training for meteorological personnel of Classes II, III and IV. During the five-year period of the project approximately 210 persons from the different Caribbean countries received training in the Institute in various branches of meteorology.

The purpose of the present project is to extend the meteorological training facilities available to the Caribbean English-speaking countries in order to meet the requirements of university-level trained meteorologists (Class I) of the participating countries. Initially courses will be offered leading to a B.Sc. degree in meteorology and it is planned to introduce later courses to provide M.Sc. and higher degrees in meteorology. The training will be provided by the Institute in association with the University of West Indies in Barbados.

UNDP assistance to this project will include the services of a senior lecturer-cum-Project Manager and two other lecturers, three fellowships for studies abroad in advanced meteorology for the training of counterpart staff, and training aids and equipment.
