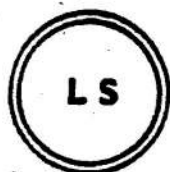

MID-WESTERN STATE PUBLIC SERVICE

COMPETITION FOR ENTRY INTO THE
ADMINISTRATIVE AND SPECIAL
DEPARTMENTAL CLASSES

The 1975 competition for entry into the Administrative and the Special Departmental Classes in the Mid-Western State of Nigeria Public Service will start in January 1975. The Special Departmental Classes comprise the Scale A posts of Assistant Registrar of Co-operative Societies, Produce Officer and Inspector of Taxes.

2. The competition will consist of :—

(a) a qualifying written examination conducted by the West African Examinations Council ;

(b) a series of tests and interviews conducted by the Public Service Selection Board ; and

(c) an interview by the Public Service Commission.

Only candidates who attain the qualifying standard in the written examination will be invited for the tests and interviews to be conducted by the Public Service Selection Board. The Public Service Commission will subsequently select, in the light of the performances of such candidates, those who will be interviewed by the Commission.

3. To be eligible to enter for the competition, a candidate, who is not already in the Public Service of the Mid-Western State of Nigeria, should either possess the following qualifications or be sitting for them in the course of the year, viz :—

(i) for the post of Administrative Officer, Grade V : A degree, preferably in Arts or Economics, from a recognised University ;

(ii) for the post of Inspector of Taxes : A degree from a recognised University, preferably in Accountancy, Arts, Commerce or Economics ;

(iii) for the post of Produce Officer : A degree from a recognised University obtained in Agriculture or other suitable discipline preferably Commerce or Economics ;

(iv) for the post of Assistant Registrar of Co-operative Societies : A degree preferably in Economics obtained from a recognised University. "Recognised" in the above context means "recognised by the Government of the Mid-Western State of Nigeria."

4. The purpose of the written examination is not to test the candidates in the subjects which they studied for their degrees, but to test their ability to think clearly, to understand and write English and also to test their knowledge of current affairs, particularly West African affairs. Notes for the guidance of candidates, drawn up by the West African Examinations Council, will be issued to all candidates by the Council in due course.

5. The written examination will consist of the following papers :—

(i) *English (Precis and Critical Appreciation)*.—This will consist of a fairly long and complex passage and candidates will be required to summarise it in their own words and to make critical comments on its central idea.

(ii) *Current Affairs*.—This will comprise two separate papers, one of which will be a paper of three compulsory questions of the traditional essay type and the other an objective test paper of fifty questions. The questions are designed to test the candidates' intelligent awareness of current affairs which any educated person may be presumed to possess.

(iii) *General*.—This will consist of two questions. The first, known as the "Logical Force Passage", will test the candidates' ability to detect illogical thinking and the second, known as "Statistical Inference Question", will test their ability to draw correct inferences from a table of numerical data.

6. The written examination will be held at the following centres : Lagos, Ibadan, Enugu, Benin City, Kaduna, Accra, Freetown, London, Washington and at such other centres as may be determined later. The dates and centres of the sitting of the Public Service Selection Board will be announced later.

7. Candidates will be responsible for their transport expenses, feeding accommodation.

8. Each candidate will be required to pay a non-refundable fee of ₦12.00. No responsibility will be accepted for money sent in any manner other than the one prescribed in paragraph 9 below.

9. Every candidate who have already applied for appointment to any of the classes mentioned in paragraph 1 above should, if resident in Nigeria, send to the Secretary, Public Service Commission, Benin City a crossed postal order or money order for the examination fee of ₦12. A candidate outside Nigeria should send the fee of ₦12.00 by crossed postal order to the authority to whom he addressed his application. The name of the applicant should be inscribed on the reverse side of the postal order or money order and the serial number(s) of such postal or money orders should be recorded in the accompanying application form or letter.

10. Candidates who have not yet applied but intend to sit for the examination should send their fees in the manner described above, together with their completed application forms to the Secretary, Public Service Commission, Benin City, if they are in West Africa or to the Nigeria High Commission (Recruitment Section), 9 Northumberland Avenue, London, W.C.2, if they are in Europe, or to the Chancery, Embassy of Nigeria, 1333, Sixteenth Street, N.W. Washington D.C. 20036, if they are in the United States of America or Canada. The official application forms are obtainable from the Secretary, Public Service Commission, Benin City, and from any of the Nigerian Diplomatic Missions abroad.

11. Serving officers will be advised later about the special arrangements being made for them.

12. The closing date of the receipt of the application forms and fees will be 14th October, 1974. Late entries will not be accepted.

13. Instructions as to the date, time and place of the examination will be sent direct to candidates by the West African Examinations Council.

UNITED NATIONS DEVELOPMENT PROGRAMME IMPROVEMENT OF THE RIVER AND FLOOD FORECASTING AND WARNING SYSTEM FOR THE INDUS RIVER BASIN IN PAKISTAN

The catastrophic floods of 1973 prompted the Government of Pakistan to request the WMO to send in March 1974 a mission to review existing flood forecasting and warning arrangements for the Indus river basin and examine the possibility for the establishment of a modern forecasting system. The main characteristics of the new system will be :

(a) the introduction of automatic telemetering stations ;

(b) improvement of the basic hydrological and meteorological station network in the whole basin (including snow observations) ;

(c) installation of a radar in or nearby Lahore to observe rainfall over inaccessible parts of the headwaters of the tributaries of the Indus river ;

(d) development of a computerized rainfall-run-off model of the basin as well as of the routing of the flood wave in the rivers aiming at improving water management of the reservoirs and river storages.

In order that this comprehensive project can be implemented UNDP as well as bilateral assistance has been requested. It is envisaged that with bilateral aid the basic hydrological observing and data collection system will be expanded and modernized. The UNDP assistance will include expertise and telemetering equipment for the establishment of a modern river and flood forecasting system and in addition a provision for the purchase of a weather radar suited for flood forecasting purposes and expertise to install it and assist in its initial operation.

The UNDP project will have a duration of two to three years and will include apart from the team leader (expert in hydrological forecasting), an expert in radar electronics, an expert in radar meteorology and four man/months of consultant services, mainly to advise on the development of the run-off and flood routing model. It includes furthermore a sum of about \$500,000 for the hydrological telemetering and radar equipment and 6 fellowships for national counterparts to be trained abroad in hydrological forecasting practices, the operation of an automatic telemetering network, and radar meteorology and maintenance.
