To make an assessment of the training needs for all categories of port personnel for the next 10 . to 15 years, firstly in the port of Manila and subsequently in the other ports of the Phillippines, taking into account the present dock labour force, its age distribution, the probable rate of admission of new entrants, the foreseen economic development of the country and its repercussions on the traffic through the ports, the foreseen changes in methods of handling cargo (introduction of palletisation, containerisation, roll-on/roll-off methods, etc.), the purchase of new equipment, the natural attrition of the dock labour force and other relevant elements.
- On the basis of this assessment, and in collaboration with the other expert assigned to the project, to determine what training facilities must be put at the disposal of port personnel in Manila and to assist the Government (the Bureau of Customs) to develop and improve the exisitng Training Centre for Port Personnel. The development of this Centre will include a determination of the type of courses to be established, the number of workers to be admitted to each course, the qualifications required for admission, the preparation of syllabi for each course and a determination of the certificates, if any, to be issued at the end of each course.

- 3. To train the counterparts in traning activities.
- 4. To pay particular attention to the training of those categories of port personnel who are most in contact with modern and highly sophisticated mechanical equipment, either in their capacity of operators of this equipment or as maintenance personnel.
- 5. In the light of the considerations above, to assist the Bureau of Customs in the establishment of courses for:
 - (a) gang leaders;
 - (b) tally clerks;
 - (c) signalmen;
 - (d) operators of mechanical equipment;
 - (e) ordinary dockworkers;
 - (f) maintenance personnel (electricians, mechanics, carpenters).
- 6. To give consideration to the establishment of training facilities for those categories of port personnel not mentioned in previous paragraphs, such as the top level supervisors, i.e. :
 - (a) pier superintendent;
 - (b) shed superintendent;
 - (c) motor pool superintendent;
 - (d) day shed supervior;
 - (e) night supervisor;
- or the first and second-line supervisors, i.e.:
 - (a) delivery supervisors;
 - (b) quay supervisors;
 - (c) supervisors of bay checkers;
 - (d) container terminal operations co-ordinator;
 - (e) supervising gate inspector;
 - (f) transfer supervisor;
 - (g) supervising timekeeper;
 - (h) receiving foreman;

 - (i) delivery foreman;
 - (j) rotation officer (company);
 - (k) rotation officer (head checker).

Qualifications required.-The expert should if possible be of Norwegian nationality and have wide experience and knowledge of training of port personnel at all levels. He should be able to prepare meaningful statistics of all available data concerning number and qualifications of existing port personnel and determine, by means of carefully devised projection, the future position for the next 10 to 15 years; and on the basis of this analysis, determine the training needs for port personnel at all levels. He should be capable of preparing appropriate syllabi for courses at all levels, to determine the number and qualifications of workers to be admitted to each course and to select the most qualified instructors for the courses to be established.

He should be capable of dealing tactfully with port authorities as well as with port personnel at all levels. He should possess imagination and flexibility, enabling him to overcome unexpected difficulties. He should have team spirit.
