(v) Faculty of Law :

3-year LL.B. Honours (Day) Course.

(vi) Faculty of the Social Sciences :

(a) 3-year B.Sc. Honours (Day) Course majoring in Economics, Political Sciences, Psychology or Sociology,

(b) 3-year B.A. Honours (Day) Course in Mass Communication, Journalism, Public Relations and Broadcasting).

(vii) Faculty of Science :

A Degree Programme by Course Units leading to Combined Honours and Special Honours Degree in Biology, Botany, Chemistry, Computer Science, Mathematics, Physics and Zoology. Instead of offering subjects, Course units in prescribed subject areas will be offered.

The Curator will be required to teach non-industrial technology and conservation in the Department of Archaeology and will be in charge of the large Departmental collections of archaeological and ethnographic materials, and also of research and field equipment. He or she will be responsible under the Head of Department for general supervision of the junior technical staff.

12. *Department of Physiology*

(a) Research Fellow

Applicants for (a) may or may not be medically qualified. Medically qualified applicants must possess registrable medical qualifications.
