Objective :

The M. B. Duration of the Course :

Admission Requirements and Procedure :

Candidates for admission will normally be expected to hold a good honours degree (not necessarily in business administration or the social sciences). Other applicants who hold lower honours degree or have equivalent professional qualifications and some years of experience in a managerial capacity will also be considered for admission to the programme. Applicants should have at least the G. C. E. Ordinary Level Mathematics or its equivalent. All intending candidates are expected to complete the official application forms. Qualified candidates will be expected to sit for an entrance examination. Exemption from the entrance examination may be granted to candidates with at least an Upper Second Class Honours degree. All candidates will be required to appear for personal interview in Lagos or at other selected centres throughout Nigeria in the middle of May 1975.
