DESIGN COMPETITION FOR THE REDEVELOPMENT OF TAFAWA BALEWA SQUARE COMPLEX, LAGOS

The Federal Government has decided to redevelop the Tafawa Balewa Square in Lagos, including the existing building complexes around the Square. The purpose of the exercise is to harmonize, architecturally, the immediate vicinity with the Square where reconstruction work is currently in progress.

- 2. The reconstructed Tafawa Balewa Square, when completed will serve primarily as the premier venue for national ceremonial occasions such as the National Day and other equally important Parades. It will, in addition, house permanently a redesigned Flame of Unity and incorporate a special Garden of Remembrance in honour of eminent Nigerians. Some of the existing facilities such as the Cricket pavillion and the Children's Play ground will be retained but they will be redesigned and modernised.

DEALING IN PETROLEUM PRODUCTS BY UNLICENCED DEALERS

It has been observed recently that a few trading firms and persons in certain parts of the Federation have been engaged in the sale of petroleum product, namely motor spirit, diesel oil, fuel oil, kerosene and lubricating oil, without the appropriate licences granted by the Federal Commissioner for Mines and Power. It is an offence under section 12 (2) (iv) of the Petroleum Decree 1969 (No. 51) for any person to import, store, sell or distribute any petroleum or petroleum products without a licence granted by the Federal Commissioner for Mines and Power. The penalty for an offence against this provision of the Decree is a fine, on conviction of a sum of N2,000. The petroleum products of any person convicted for an offence is liable to forfeiture.

2. It is also an offence to sell petroleum products or any particular classes thereof in any part of the

Federation over or above the prices fixed by the order of the Federal Commissioner for Mines and Power. The penalty for the contravention of this provision of the Decree is a fine, on conviction, of a sum of \$\frac{1}{2},000\$. The petroleum products of any person convicted for an offence is liable to forfeiture.

3. All persons who have either been engaged in the sale of petroleum products without appropriate licences or who have, with appropriate licences, been selling petroleum products above the prices fixed by law are warned in their own interest to desist forthwith from such practices. Henceforth, the law enforcement agencies will ensure that the laws regulating the sale and control of petroleum products are strictly enforced.

Background information.—The major objective of the present project is to assist the Social Security Organisation (SOCSO) in increasing its capability and capacity by improving, planning and implementing various social security measures in the country. The existing social security scheme under the Employees' Social Security Act, 1969, was put into operation in October 1971, in respect of employment injury and in January 1974 in respect of invalidity. The scheme now applies to 21 urban centres and has registered 15,000 establishments with 500,000 employees. The Government has announced its intention to include benefits in the case of sickness, maternity and death of the breadwinner. SOCSO is committed to a policy of rapid expansion of geographical coverage which will add an estimated 60 per cent to its membership within about one year.

There are a number of fundamental problems associated with the social security coverage of farmers and fishermen, which presently prevent their inclusion in the social security scheme. SOCSO is to undertake comprehensive studies in depth of the conditions of farmers and fishermen in order to establish a factual framework for future decisions on the social security protection of these workers. As an immediate measure, SOCSO is to make rural areas a prime objective in its expansion programmes so as to cover a eligible establishments and employees without delay.

It is also engaged upon an extensive internal reorganisation of the social security institution, including basic planning for the computerisation of the main administrative processes.

In addition to the proposed pension scheme which is to follow invalidity pensions, the Government is examining the possibility of introducing a comprehensive pension scheme which will provide old age pensions, as well as invalidity and survivors' pensions. This will require certain modifications in the existing Employees' Provident Fund Scheme of 1951.
