Now THEREFORE, I, BRIGADIER HENRY EDMUND OLUFEMI ADEFORE, FEDERAL COMMISSIONER FOR LABOUR' in exercise of the powers conferred upon me by section 4 (2) of the Trade Disputes (Emergency Provisions) (Amendment) Decree 1969 hereby refer the matters in dispute to the Industrial Arbitration Tribunal with the following terms of reference :---

"To inquire into the trade dispute in existence between the Lipton Workers' Union of Nigeria and the Lipton of Nigeria Limited in accordance with section 4 (1) of the Trade Disputes (Emergency Provisions) (Amendment) Decree 1969 over the following issues :---

"(1) That the Union should not accept any further retrenchment since twenty-three (23) workers were declared redundant in February 1975;

(2) That a Company employing less than 300 Junior Workers should in no circumstances maintain a team of 30 managers;

(3) That the management staff be reduced by 15 since most of them have no well defined functions;

(4) That any attempt by the management to retrench any worker or workers should be met with equal resentment; and

(5) That the implementation of Udoji awards be re-examined as the workers were short-paid" and to make such awards, having regard to the circumstances of the dispute, and such other matters pertaining thereto or arising therefrom as the Industrial Arbitration Tribunal may deem necessary".
