BY UNLICENCED DEALERS**

It has been observed recently that a few trading firms and persons in certain parts of the Federation have been engaged in the sale of petroleum products, namely motor spirit, diesel oil, fuel oil kerosene and lubricating oil, without the appropriate licences granted by the Federal Commissioner for Mines and Power. It is an offence under section 12 (2) (iv) of the Petroleum Decree 1969 (No. 51) for any person to import, store, sell or distribute any petroleum or petroleum products without a licence granted by the Federal Commissioner for Mines and Power. The Army and Police have been empowered to arrest any person selling or dealing in petrol without a licence properly issued by the Ministry of Mines and Power. Petroleum products stored by any person so arrested will be confiscated.

2. It is also an offence to sell petroleum products in any part of the Federation over or above the prices fixed by the order of the Federal Commissioner for Mines and Power. The Government has also decided that henceforth motor spirits and diesel should be sold into the tanks of vehicles. If any sale is made into a drum or any other type of container other than vehicle tanks, the capacity of such a drum or container must not exceed 20 litres.

3. The Army and Police have also been empowered to deal with any persons who contravene these directives.

4. The general public is urged to co-operate with the law enforcement agencies and petroleum products distribution personnel to ensure the orderly distribution of petroleum products in the general interest.

Presently, the majority of pre-vocational trainees are in the construction field. Carpentry and masonry are the main courses. Approximately 150 boys are in these activities. It is envisaged that the four new centres now being added (1974) will also start courses in carpentry and masonry. By March 1975, the target is 360 trainees in the two courses at nine centres. By the end of 1975 at least five additional centres will be added to the project.

Present plans call for at least one UNV, trained in construction, and it is envisaged that at least one additional UNV will be required. The expert will be responsible to supervise the UNV(s).

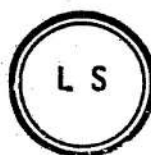

IN THE SUPREME COURT OF NIGERIA

Notaries Public Act (Chapter 141)
