DEALING IN PETROLEUM PRODUCTS BY UNLICENCED DEALERS

It has been observed recently that a few trading firms and persons in certain parts of the Federation have been engaged in the sale of petroleum products, namely motor spirit, diesel oil, fuel oil kerosene and lubricating oil, without the appropriate licences granted by the Federal Commissioner for Mines and Power. It is an offence under section 12 (2) (iv) of the Petroleum Decree 1969 (No. 51) for any person to import, store, sell or distribute any petroleum or petroleum products without a licence granted by the Federal Commissioner for Mines and Power. The Army and Police have been empowered to arrest any person selling or dealing in petrol without a licence properly issued by the Ministry of Mines and Power. Petroleum products stored by any person so arrested will be confiscated.

- 2. It is also an offence to sell petroleum products in any part of the Federation over or above the prices fixed by the order of the Federal Commissioner for Mines and Power. The Government has also decided that henceforth motor spirits and diesel should be sold into the tanks of vehicles. If any sale is made into a drum or any other type of container other than vehicle tanks, the capacity of such a drum or container must not exceed 20 litres.
- 3. The Army and Police have also been empowered to deal with any persons who contravene these directives.
- 4. The general public is urged to co-operate with the law enforcement agencies and petroleum products distribution personnel to ensure the orderly distribution of petroleum products in the general interest.

Regular Government staff and trainees from the Youth Training Centres will carry out the systematic short, intensive training at the villages and/or in the fields as part of a mobile training scheme to be launched within SUD/73/004. The Village Youth Clubs will follow the traditional 4-H Club concept for developing countries, with the required modifications for Sudanese youth in the various portions of the country.

The expert will concentrate his efforts in two pilot areas; Juba in the Southern Region and somewhere in the Western Region. (The expert will survey and make his recommendations). The expert will be expected to write and produce the materials required to institutionalise a rural youth club programme plus assist to produce the required project manuals needed for instruction at club level. In addition, the expert will be responsible for the in-service training of staff seconded to carry out the administration and activities of the Village Youth Clubs.

As a consequence of the above, the expert-to-be must be experienced in all aspects of 4-H Club youthwork, type administration at country or above level, plus have experience in the production of Club and project materials.

The expert will be stationed in Juba (Southern Region). It should be mentioned that the duty station is considered to be extremely difficult for normal living. Shortages of all conceivable goods persist continually; most all commodities, foodstuff, etc. must be air freighted in from Nairobi. No schools exist for young children. The expert will be expected to travel often for prolonged periods to the various parts of the Southern Region and the Western Region.

Travel, accommodation, food, etc. is extremely harsh in most instances, consequently, the person selected and his wife must have recently demonstrated their ability to adapt to hardship conditions and maintain a sense of humour in the face of privation. It is recommended that the person selected not exceed 40 years in age, have excellent health and be in excellent physical condition. One role the expert will undertake is to act as a "communication link" between the Project Manager (stationed in Khartoum) and the Minister responsible for youth activities for the Southern Region (Juba). It is planned that the expert will in fact have his office in the Ministry (Juba) and advise and counsel the Minister in the training aspects for Rural Youth development.

Description of duties.—Under the supervision of the Project Manager the expert will assist the Department of Youth and Sports, Ministry of Culture and Information, in the planning, introduction and institutionalising of Rural Youth Clubs to provide skills training on a non-formal basis. In particular he will advise and assist the Minister of Information, Culture, Youth and Tourism, Southern Region, in this undertaking. Although based in Juba the expert will have to travel extensively in the Southern and Western Regions of Sudan.

The tasks of the expert will be as follows:

(a) To formulate and carry out in-service training of personnel for the Department of Youth and Sports, who will become responsible for the administration and training activities of the Rural Youth Clubs.

- (b) Undertake preparation of programme and instructional materials required for the Rural Youth Clubs and attendant training activities.
- (c) In conjunction with the Project Manager of SUD/73/004 and the Team Leader SUD/74/022 assess the skills required in rural villages for which courses will be provided by mobile training
- (d) Supervise the work of the UNVs on the Rural Youth Club non-formal training programme.
- (e) Participate in any other activities which the Project Manager may find necessary in the implementation of the project objectives.

Qualifications required.—A degree or diploma in agriculture or agriculture education from a recognised institute or college.

Long service in rural youth work at local council and national levels (4-H club type programmes).

Experience of preparing manuals for rural youth projects especially in a developing country.

Practical experience in teaching agriculture and rural skills to primary school students and post primary school leavers.

Language required.-English.
