WHEREAS by section 1 (2) of Federal Revenue Court Decree 1973 it is provided that the Federal Revenue Court shall consist of the President and fourteen Judges :

AND WHEREAS by section 2 (3) of the aforesaid Decree it is provided that if the President is for any reason unable to perform the functions of his office, then, until the President has resumed those functions, those functions shall be performed by such one of the other Judges of the Federal Revenue Court as may be designated in that behalf by the Supreme Military Council, acting after consultation with the Advisory Judicial Committee :

NOW, THEREFORE, THE SUPREME MILITARY COUNCIL, acting after consultation with the Advisory Judicial Committee, do hereby appoint Mr JUSTICE JEMONU OMO-EBOH to act as President of the Federal Revenue Court with effect from 2nd June, 1975 in the absence on leave of Mr JUSTICE SIGISMUND OLANREWAJU LAMBO.

(b) Develop the activities of the Hydrological Service with a view to setting up, in the medium-term, an integrated national Hydrometeorological Service;

(c) Draw up a detailed training syllabus for the various grades of technical personnel and take part in the training;

(d) Prepare lists of specifications for the equipment which will be provided under the project;

(e) Supervise the elaboration under a subcontract of a plan for the development of hydrological basins in central Guinea.

Qualifications.—Candidates should have had training at university level and wide experience in all the fields of applied hydrology, in the organization and administration of a Hydrological Service on a national scale;

*Annex to GUI/WMO/12**Assistance to the National Hydrological Service and Development of Hydrological Basins in Central Guinea*

The Government of Guinea has undertaken to complete the efforts it has already made by developing hydrological networks and the operational infrastructure capable of operating these networks and also to study the data already collected by integrating these activities within a national Hydrological Service extending its activities to the entire territory and providing the personnel and equipment necessary for carrying out this task satisfactorily. The government has decided to request the assistance of the United Nations Development Programme (UNDP) to back up their efforts.

The duration of the project will be five years during which time the national Hydrological Service will be set up, complete with staff and material components, both in the field and office. The international team of experts consists of a Project Manager and an expert in operational hydrology. Specialists in various fields will be attached to this nucleus for shorter terms and will take part in setting up certain specialized functions of the

future Service. Under the project, provision is further made for the study of the hydrological development of one of the natural regions of the country which will be carried out by sub-contract.

The training of a sufficient number of personnel in the Hydrological Service is an important aspect of the project. Provision is made for training abroad a certain number of hydrological engineers by means of fellowships. Two courses, each lasting approximately 18 months, will be organized locally to provide basic training for technicians and will open up the way to practical training in the field and in the workshops, and the experts of the project will play a large part in this training which will be provided jointly with instructors from Guinea.

The project makes provision for the supply of a large amount of material ranging from means of transport, through hydrometric, telecommunication and office equipment.

Programme for strengthening the Agrometeorological and Hydrological Services of the Sahelian countries and establishment of a Centre for training and applications of agrometeorology/operational hydrology

The strengthening of national Services and the setting up of the Centre are among the medium-term and long-term measures intended to minimize the effects of climatological disasters and to improve the living conditions of the inhabitants of this area. The seven countries affected by the drought have set up a joint body in order to combine their efforts: the Permanent Inter-State Committee for the Fight Against Drought in the Sahel (CILSS). These countries are: the Gambia, Upper Volta, Mali, Mauritania, Niger, Senegal and Chad.

The present programme consists of:

Seven national projects intended to develop the agrometeorological and hydrological observational networks, to strengthen services for data processing and providing users with short-term forecasts, and lastly, the training of technical personnel required for these tasks;

a regional Centre to provide training for these personnel. This Centre will subsequently have personnel and equipment for data processing on a regional basis.

Each national project comprises:

the services of an expert for two years, responsible for supervising meteorological and agrometeorological activities undertaken in the country;

the supply of equipment for strengthening the networks;

granting fellowships;

hydrological activities undertaken under a sub-contract with ORSTOM (except the Gambia).

The Centre comprises:

the services of a Programme Manager responsible for the management and implementation of the entire programme;

the services of four instructors in meteorology (2), agrometeorology (1) and climatology (1);

the services of two experts in operational hydrology responsible for planning and supervising the work of the sub-contractor;

the supply of didactic material.

It is also proposed to add data processing facilities on a regional scale by attaching two experts, providing data processing equipment and a telecommunication network for the collection and redistribution of these data.

The duration of these operations will be five years for the Centre and two years for the national projects.

The programme should commence in April 1975.
