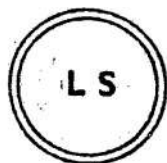

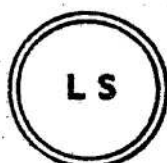

PRELIMINARY ANNOUNCEMENT

The College programme for 1976-77 will include four Advanced General Management Courses.
