As modified by the Constitution (Suspension and Modification) Decree 1966 and the (Creation and Transitional Provisions) Decree 1967

BRIGADIER MURTALA RAMAT MUHAMMED, Head of the Federal Military Government, Commander-in-Chief of the Armed Forces

Whereas by section 48 (2) of the Constitution of the Mid-Western State as modified by the Constitution (Suspension and Modification) Decree 1966, it is provided that the Judges of the High Court of Mid-Western State shall be the Chief Justice and such number of other Judges (not being less than six) as may be prescribed by law:

AND WHEREAS by section 49 (1) of the Constitution of the Mid-Western State modified as aforesaid it is provided that the Chief Justice and other Judges of the High Court of Mid-Western State shall be appointed by the Supreme Military Council, acting after consultation with the Advisory Judicial Committee;

Now, THEREFORE, THE SUPREME MILITARY COUNCIL, acting after consultation with the Advisory Judicial Committee, do hereby appoint Samson Odemwingie Uwaifo a judge of the High Court of Mid-Western State with effect from 1st day of May, 1975.

Whereas by section 48 (2) of the Constitution of Mid-Western State as modified by the Constitution (Suspension and Modification) Decree 1966, it is provided that the Judges of the High Court of Mid-Western State shall be the Chief Justice and such number of other Judges (not being less than six) as may be prescribed by law:

AND WHEREAS by section 49 (1) of the Constitution of the Mid-Western State modified as aforesaid it is provided that the Chief Justice and other Judges of the High Court of Mid-Western State shall be appointed by the Supreme Military Council, acting after consultation with the Advisory Judicial Committee:

Now, THEREFORE, THE SUPREME MILITARY COUNCIL, acting after consultation with the Advisory Judicial Commitee, do hereby appoint JOSEPH BROOKMAN AMISSAH a Judge of the High Court of Mid-Western State with effect from 1st day of May, 1975.
