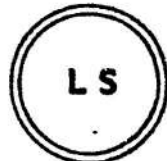

1. The Directors have pleasure in presenting to the Fifth Annual General Meeting the Annual Report and Accounts of the Corporation for the year ended 31st December, 1974.

2. *Fire Department.*—The net premium income for the year amounted to ₦471,542 (1973 : ₦414,481). The sum of ₦245,504 was transferred to the Profit and Loss Account.

3. *Marine and Aviation Department.*—The net premium income for the year was ₦178,424 (1973 : ₦72,143). The increased profit of ₦162,246 (1973 : ₦116,895) was due to the substantial increase in commission receivable which went up from ₦285,914 in 1973 to ₦439,048 in 1974.

4. *Miscellaneous Accident Department.*—The net premiums written for these classes amounted to ₦3,821,460 (1973 : ₦2,382,924). A total of ₦289,296 was transferred to Profit and Loss Account.

5. *Life Department.*—The net premium written amounted to ₦633,611 (1973 : ₦102,746). The total Life Fund—including the Life Grant—as at 31st December, 1974 was ₦1,110,584.

CHAIRMAN'S STATEMENT

In my last report presented to you about 12 months ago, I indicated that the Corporation was likely to achieve greater success in 1974. I am pleased to say that this has been the case. The overall net premium income including life business was increased by 72 per cent from ₦2,972,294 in 1973 to ₦5,106,838 in 1974.

It is a matter for regret however that the substantial increase in net premium income was not matched by corresponding increase in the net profit. This was due to circumstances entirely beyond our control. The Corporation's experience like those of other insurers in the market—on its motor business was very bad. The net profit from this class of business went down from ₦346,888 in 1973 to ₦5,383 in 1974. Management expenses increased considerably as a result of inflation and 'Udoji'. Staff salaries, the largest single item of management expense went up by 78 per cent. The arrears resulting from the Udoji Award cost the Corporation ₦111,383.

During the year under review, no new branch offices were opened. Efforts were concentrated on consolidating the existing branches. It is intended during 1975 to further extend our activities by opening new branches in some other states.

Our approach to investment which was reviewed in favour of diversification has proved to be of tremendous benefit and an appreciable investment income was earned during the year. Our subsidiary company, 'Niger Insurance' was re-activated towards the end of the year. The intention is to streamline our life operations during 1975 by the fusion into one unit of our Life Department and the Niger.

Our financial position has been further strengthened by a substantial increase of ₦500,000 in our General Reserves which now stands at ₦2,000,000. This should improve our capacity to absorb higher risks in the future and enhance our stature at home and abroad.

The progress achieved during the year has been due largely to the hard work and determination of the Management and Staff and to the support received from our policy holders, brokers and agents. I, therefore, wish on behalf of the Board to express my gratitude to them all.

Our entry into new areas of insurance activities and the increasing economic boom in the country cannot but result in rapid expansion and a much brighter future for the Corporation.

FINANCIAL YEAR ENDED 31st DECEMBER, 1974

(Made Pursuant to section 24 (3) (a) of Decree No. 22 of 1969)

1. *Share Capital.*—There was no change in the Authorised and Issued Share Capital of the Corporation which remained at the same amount of ₦2 million as in the previous financial years. The Federal Military Government of Nigeria also remained the Sole Shareholders of the Corporation.

2. *General Reserve.*—An amount of ₦500,000 was transferred to General Reserve in respect of the financial year under review and this brought the total amount at 31st December, 1974 to ₦2,000,000.

3. *Leasehold Buildings and Lands.*—Two new Leasehold Buildings at 22 Commercial Road, Apapa and 13B Post Office Road, Kano purchased in the year brought the number of the Corporation's Real Properties to four. The building at 22 Commercial Road, Apapa cost ₦106,730.00 while the one at No. 13B Post Office Road, Kano cost ₦100,521.50.

Apart from the buildings, the Corporation was able to finalise and secure the Leasehold Agreement in respect of the Plot of Land at No. 5 Customs Street, Lagos which was commenced in the previous financial year. An additional expenditure of ₦80,388.90 incurred on the Plot brought the expenditure in respect of the first ten year's rent to ₦277,463.90. The rent of ₦250,000 has been transferred to Rent Schedule while various Professional Fees amounting to ₦27,463.90 have been treated as deposit pending capitalisation.

In addition, the Corporation acquired a Plot of Land at the Independence Layout, Enugu for a premium of ₦3,294.90 and a Tarkwa Bay Plot in the Lagos State from the Nigerian Ports Authority for ₦40.10.

4. *Investments.*—The Corporation's Investments remained diversified during 1974 financial year under review.

The details of the Investments which amounted to ₦3,674,710.62 are contained in Schedule II annexed to the Accounts but a broad analysis of the total Investments can be made thus :—

12. *Reserve for Unexpired risks.*—The rate of 40 per cent of Net premiums has been adopted as generally practised in the Insurance Industry for own Premiums' Incomes except in the Marine, Aviation and Transit Division where a rate of 100 per cent has been considered necessary in view of the considerable time-lag between the notification of claims and settlement. The same rate was adopted in the previous financial years.

13. *Contingent Liabilities.*—The Corporation had no contingent liability in respect of guarantees on Promissory Notes issued by Commercial Banks and discounted with the Central Bank of Nigeria at 31st December, 1974 (1973 ₦7,573,288).

14. *NICON Staff Provident Fund and Pension Scheme.*—The Corporation has now taken initial step on the provisions of section 23 of Decree No. 22 of 1969 in respect of Staff Welfare and Pension Scheme by setting aside and paying over a sum of ₦6,388 to the Life Department in respect of the Scheme.

A further amount of ₦233,612 has been provided in the Accounts of the Corporation in order to meet possible increased costs for the period from 1st July, 1969 to 31st December, 1974.

In effect the total amount earmarked for the Scheme up to 31st December, 1974 is ₦240,000.

15. *Special Direction.*—The Federal Executive Council has not issued to us any special directions to carry out any special examination pursuant to the provisions of section 25 of Decree No. 22 of 1969. We, therefore have nothing to report in that connection.
