APPLICATION FOR AN OIL PIPELINE LICENCE

Notice is hereby given in accordance with section 8 of the Oil Pipeline Act (Cap. 145) 1965, that the Nigerian National Oil Corporation has applied to the Federal Ministry of Petroleum and Energy for the grant of a licence to enter upon, take possession of and use for 20 (twenty) year a strip of land for the purpose of laying one 6" diameter oil pipeline ("production line") from a point in the Corporation's Ossu Oil Field in Oguta Division to a point in the Corporation's Izombe Flowstation in the Corporation's Izombe Oil Field in Oguta Division of the East-Central State, the route of which is demarcated on the ground by a survey trace marked with yellow stakes and is herein described.

DESCRIPTION

All that strip of land approximately 4.5 Km. long situated within the Oguta Division of the East-Central State, the route of which traverses dry land and seasonal swamp and is shown hatched in red in the Corporation's plan No. AL-60 dated October 1975. The width of the way leave will be variable and will be approximately as follows :

(a) Where the route traverses dry land and seasonal swamp .. (15.25m) 50 ft.

(b) In the vicinity of all points of intersection (P.I.'s) (22.87m) 75 ft.

Where in the following text the bearing of the line is described as proceeding to a certain P.I. the line will follow a simple curve from a tangent point before the P.I. and will enter the next bearing at a tangent point after the P.I. The exact distance from tangent point to tangent point will vary according to the radius of the curve used.

The route of the line is described as follows :

Starting at the proposed out-going manifold at Ossu marked P.I.0 on the plan whose Nigerian Co-ordinates are E479,995, N180,700 the route then proceeds on a bearing of 86° 37' for a distance of 152m to a point marked P.I.-1, thence on a bearing of 113° 46' for a distance of 1,878m to a point marked P.I.-2, thence on a bearing 114° 17', for a distance of 1,617m to a point marked P.I.-3,

thence on a bearing of 96° 05', for a distance of 198m to a point marked P.I.-4, thence on a bearing of 114° 21' for a distance of 383m to a point marked P.I.-5, thence on a bearing of 204° 14' for a distance of 44m to a point marked P.I.-6, thence on a bearing of 113° 49' for a distance of 253m to a point marked P.I.-7, thence on a bearing of 22° 23' for a distance of 18m to a point marked P.I.-8 whose Nigerian Co-ordinates are E484,108, N178,990 which is the tie-in point at the Corpora-tion's Izombe Flowstation. All bearings coordinates and distances are approximate and all bearings refer to Grid North. The Oil Pipeline will have a minimum soil cover of 2 feet.

2. A copy of a plan of the pipeline route identifying the land affected can be inspected during all normal working hours at the Divisional Office, Owerri, the Ministry of Lands and Housing, Enugu, the Federal Ministry of Petroleum and Energy, Port Harcourt and Lagos, and at the offices in Lagos of the aforesaid Corporation.

3. Any person who considers that his land or interests in land will be injuriously affected by the grant of the licence should lodge orally or in writing. not less than seven days before the hearing date in paragraph 5, with the Ministry of Lands and Housing (Lands Division), Enugu, notice of objection stating the interest of the objector and the grounds of the objection.

4. Any Public Officer who receives a verbal objection in the course of his duty shall record the name and address, interest and grounds of objection+ and shall forward such details to the Ministry of Lands and Housing (Lands Division), Enugu.

5. The delegate of the Ministry of Lands and Housing (Lands Division), Enugu, shall enquire into objections (if any) duly lodged in accordance with paragraphs 3 and 4 above at his office at Enugu at 10 a.m. on the 23rd day of February, 1976, giving all parties an opportunity to be heard.

Reports thereof shall be sent without delay to the Director of Petroleum Resources, Federal Federal Ministry of Petroleum and Energy, Lagos.

HYDROMETEOROLOGICAL SURVEY OF THE CATCHMENTS OF THE LAKES VICTORIA, KYOGA AND MOBUTU SESE SEKO (Phase II)

Data on the equatorial lakes of the Nile has considerable international significance. The drainage area of the Upper Nile covers parts of Uganda, Kenya, Tanzania, Rwanda, Burundi and Zaire. Egypt and Sudan are interested in the data and so is Ethiopia. The need for evaluation of the water balance of Lake Victoria, and its catchments has long been realized and efforts were initiated by the Governments in the fifties and sixties. The Project for the Hydrometeorological Survey which commenced in 1967 with the assistance of the UNDP and WMO was completed by the end of August 1972. During this period about sixty hydrological stations were set up as well as twenty-five meteorological stations, ten lake level recording stations, two hundred ordinary rainguage stations, besides improving and upgrading several existing meteoro-logical and hydrological stations. Seven index catchments were selected and densely instrumented for intensive studies. Topographic surveys of critical flat lake shore areas were conducted in Lake Victoria and a complete hydrographic survey was done for Lake Kyoga.

The principal problem in the period after August 1972, was the utilization of the large mass of data collected. As a result of studies made for the development of a plan for the conservation of available water resources including storage, regulation and use of the Nile, a Phase II project has been developed; its main objective is to formulate a mathematical model representing the Upper Nile system including the lakes and rivers in all the riparian countries to help in the future development of the water resources of the Upper Nile.

The project will have a duration of three years and will include apart from the Chief Technical Adviser, an expert in data processing, a systems analyst and various consultant missions, provision for a subcontract to develop the mathematical model, several fellowships and funds for the purchase of spares for existing equipment and for land and water transport.

The Meteorological Training and Research Institute is an institution set up by the Federal Government of Nigeria with the assistance of a United Nations Development Programme (UNDP) project. WMO has been designated as the Executing Agency for this project.

The establishment of the Institute reflects the desire of the Federal Government to strengthen and develop services in the Meteorological Department in Nigeria by intensifying training activities and by creating facilities for applied research projects in meteorology. In addition, a Central Forecasting Office, which will co-ordinate activities related to forecasting for aeronautics, agriculture, water resources and other purposes will be established; a marine meteorological service of the Meteorological Department will also be created.

The intensification and widening of training activities will be achieved by combining and expanding the activities of the former Regional Meteorological Training Centre at Ikeja and the Meteorological Training Centre at Oshodi into the Nigerian Meteorological Training and Research Institute. The Regional Meteorological Training Centre at Lagos, which was established with the support of WMO under a regional UNDP project was responsible for the training of Class II meteorologists and has trained many students from Nigeria, Sudan, Botswana, Ghana, Malawi, Cameroon and Sierra Leone.

At the new Institute, the training of Class II meteorologists will continue. In addition, the training of Class I meteorologists for Nigeria and other African countries is planned in collaboration with the University of Ibadan. The training of Class IV meteorological personnel will continue to be the entire responsibility of Nigerian instructors.

The Senior Expert will be responsible for the implementation of the project and for the administrative aspects of the activities of the team of international experts assigned to the project. This team comprises the Senior Expert (dynamic and synoptic meteorology), an Expert in General Meteorological Training, an Expert in Agrometeorological Research, an Instructor in Agrometeorology and one in Hydrometeorology.

The project includes considerable inputs by the Federal Government; it is scheduled to have a total duration of four years.

ANNEX TO RAF/WMO/20

EXPLANATORY NOTE

Programme for strengthening the Agrometeorological and Hydrological Services of the Sahelian countries and establishment of a Centre for training and applications, of agrometeorology/operational hydrology.

The strengthening of national services and the setting up of the Centre are among the mediumterm and long-term measures intended to minimize the effects of climatological disasters and to improve the living conditions of the inhabitants of this area. The seven countries affected by the drought have set up a joint body in order to combine their efforts : the Permanent Inter-State Committee for the Fight Against Drought in the Sahel (CILSS). These countries are : the Cambia, Upper Volta, Mali, Mauritania, Niger, Senegal and Chad.

The present programme consists of :

Seven national projects intended to develop the agrometeorological and hydrological observational networks, to strengthen services for data processing and providing users with short-term forecasts, and lastly, the training of technical personnel required for these tasks :

a regional Centre to provide training for these personnel. This Centre will subsequently have personnel and equipment for data processing on a regional basis.

Each national project comprises :

the services of an expert for two years, responsible for supervising meteorological and agrometeorological activities undertaken in the country ;

the supply of equipment for strengthening the networks ;

granting fellowships ;

hydrological activities undertaken under a subcontract with ORSTOM (except the Gambia). The Centre comprises :

the services of a Programme Manager responsible for the management and implementation of the entire programme ;

the services of four instructors in meteorology (2), agrometeorology (1) and climatology (1);

the services of two experts in operational hydrology responsible for planning and supervising the work of the subcontractor;

the supply of didactic material.

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It is also proposed to add data processing facilities on a regional scale by attaching two experts, providing data processing equipment and a telecommunication network for the collection and redistribution of these data.

The duration of these operations will be five years for the Centre and two years for the national projects.

The programme in the Centre commenced in June 1975. The present post is part of the national project for Mauritania.
