MONETARY POLICY CIRCULAR NO. 8

CENTRAL BANK CREDIT GUIDELINES FOR 1976-77

The emphasis of Central Bank credit guidelines in the last four years has been on the need to allocate the bulk of the banks' credit to the more productive sectors of the economy with a view to stimulating increased production of essential goods and services as a means of combating inflationary pressures.

In the past year, it became obvious that the objective of containing inflationary pressures had not been achieved as the rate of inflation rose to 33.9 per cent from 13.4 and 6.1 per cent in 1974 and 1973, respectively. Commercial bank expansion of credit to the private sector was one of the main factors responsible for the exacerbation of inflationary pressures. The banks' loans and advances rose by 63.9 per cent in 1975 compared with the increases of 24.5 per cent in 1974 and 21.6 per cent in 1973.

- 1. Aggregate loans.—Under these circumstances, it has become necessary to re-impose ceiling on commercial banks' aggregate loans and advances in the next fiscal year. On the basis of individual bank's loans and advances outstanding at the end of March 1976, each bank's monthly aggregate of loans and advances (as per sections A and B of the Second Schedule) should not rise by more than 40 per cent during the 1976-77 fiscal year.
- 2. Sectoral Distribution of Loans.—The existing directives on sectoral and sub-sectoral credit allocations are retained with only minor adjustments. The adjustments are a reduction in allocation to general commerce from 32 to 30 per cent and a corresponding increase in the allocation to 'Others' from 10 to 12 per cent. The composition of such loans and advances to the various sectors/sub-sectors of the economy in 1976-77 shall be as follows:

TOTAL (A) and (B)

An analysis of the performance of commercial banks in relation to the guidelines have shown that most banks have persistently failed to meet the targets stipulated in the various guidelines from April 1972 to December 1975. From now on, sanctions will be imposed on any bank that fails to comply with the credit guidelines. Any bank that exceeds the guideline stipulations in respect of credit to the less productive sector/sub-sectors will receive a warning on the first default. For any subsequent defaults or continuation of a default, the bank will be asked to pay to the Central Bank a penalty on the excess credit. The sanctions will be as follows:

1st Month-Warning.

2nd Month-Payment of 1 per cent of the excess credit.

3rd Month-Payment of # per cent of the excess credit.

4th Month-Payment of § per cent of the excess credit.

5th Month—Payment of 1 per cent of the excess credit.

3. Loans to indigenous persons.—Each Bank's loan and advances to indigenous borrowers shall continue to be not less than 40 per cent of the aggregate loans and advances in each month.

- 4. Capital funds.—During the year before any funds can be applied for the payment of dividends, every bank shall maintain a ratio of not less than one to ten (1:10) between its adjusted capital funds and loans and advances (that is the former should not be less than 10 per cent of the latter).
- 5. Cash reserve requirement.—Each commercial bank is required to maintain, henceforth, a minimum amount of cash deposits with the Central Bank of Nigeria at its Head Office in Lagos. The cash deposits shall be expressed as a ratio of each bank's total demand deposits plus time deposits on which it pays its depositors interest of less than 2½ per cent per annum. For the purpose of cash reserve requirement, the banks have been divided into four classes. The classes and the minimum ratio of cash they are to maintain with the Central Bank are as follows:

6. Liquidity Ration¹.—The minimum liquid assets ratio shall remain at 25 per cent. Commercial banks are, however, no longer required to hold at least 40 per cent of their specified liquid assets in treasury bills, treasury certificates and eligible development stocks.

Cash held with the Central Bank for purpose of meeting the cash reserve requirement shall be excluded from eligible assets for computing the minimum liquid assets ratio.

- 7. Interest rates.—Until further notice the following interest rates structure shall be observed by all banks:—
 - (i) Lending rates: Interest rate charges on loans and advances shall be within the range of 6-10 per cent per annum, but charges on lending to the productive sectors/sub-sectors shall not be higher than 8 per cent.
 - (ii) Minimum interest payable on savings account up to ₹20,000 is 4 per cent per annum; while interest on other deposits shall be negotiable.
 - (iii) Maximum commission chargeable on foreign exchange transfers:
 - ‡ per cent above Central Bank exchange rate.
 - (iv) Hitherto, some banks have used either the Discount method or the Straight Line (or simple interest) method for calculating the interest on loans payable in agreed instalments, instead of the Product or Reducing Balance method. By using either of the two former methods, the banks charge more than the contracted rates, thereby breaching or flouting Central Bank's directives on interest charges. Henceforth all banks are required to apply the Reducing Balance method in calculating their interest charges on loans and advances.
 - (v) Interest on savings account shall be calculated on the balance existing on the customer's account on the 15th of each month.
- 8. Stabilisation Securities.—The Central Bank of Nigeria would issue stabilisation securities in order to provide the commercial banks with an additional avenue for the investment of the savings deposited with them. The amount to be considered shall be the increase in savings deposits over the level outstanding on 31st March, 1976, arising from deposits in individual savings accounts not exceeding ₹20,000 each. The interest payable on stabilisation securities shall be 4 per cent, or any such rate as might be determined from time to time by the Central Bank. Stabilisation securities shall be non-negotiable, non-transferable and shall be ineligible to count as part of commercial bank liquid assets. Details will be communicated to the banks.
 - 9. Merchant Banks.—The composition of merchant banks' loans and advances shall be as follows:

IMPROVEMENT OF RIVER AND FLOOD FORECASTING SYSTEMS IN INDIA

India is traversed by a large number of river systems and experiences seasonal floods. The average area affected by floods is about 6.7 million hectares including a cropped area of 2.6 million hectares. The floods affect a population of 19 million and take a toll of 735 human lives and over 41,600 cattle on an average per year. The available statistics indicate that the flood damage is increasing in recent years and reached an all time high in the year 1971.

The long-term solution for prevention of floods is the construction of flood control and flood protection works like detection reservoirs, embankments and drainage schemes. A large number of such works have been undertaken and completed, and about one-third of the area prone to floods has benefitted from flood control measures. However, while flood control measures are being carried out for reducing the losses caused by floods, it is not possible to provide protection at all places for all magnitudes of floods. Experience has shown that loss to human lives and property can be reduced to a considerable extent by giving advance information of the coming floods.

The techniques currently being used for flood forecasting afford only a limited advance warning of the coming floods. It is felt that the warning time can be substantially increased by adoption of improved techniques for flood forecasting, by strengthening of the existing set up and augmenting technical facilities. The proposed improvements are to be brought about in a phased manner. As a first step, it is proposed that the present Flood Forecasting Centre at Delhi be developed as a model flood forecasting centre with automated hydrological network over the upper Yamuna basin. This centre has been selected because Delhi is the headquarters of the two organizations concerned with flood forecasting activities, viz.: the Central Water Commission and the India Meteorological Department, which keep hydrological and hydrometeorological data over the past many years, and also because Delhi has computer facilities available.

In order to implement a project for improvement of river and flood forecasting systems in India, the Government has requested assistance by UNDP, and WMO has been designated as executing agency. The UNDP assistance will include expertise and equipment for the establishment of modern river and flood forecasting systems, including a video integrator processor for a 10 cm S-band radar acquired by the Indian Meteorological Department. The WMO/UNDP project will have a duration of two years and will include, apart from the team leader (expert in hydrological forecasting systems) an expert in flash floods, an expert in snow hydrology and an expert in radar hydrology. It includes furthermore a sum of about US \$400.000—for the hydrological telemetering equipment and a video-integrator processor, 9 fellowships for national counterparts to be trained abroad in flood fore-casting and flow routing techniques, instrumentation of flood forecasting, rainfall-radar-computer systems, hydrometeorological aspects of flood forecasting and snow-melt hydrology.

Programme for strenghtening the Agrometeorological and Hydrological Services of the Sahelian Countries and establishment of a Centre for training and applications of Agrometeorology/Operational Hydrology

The strenghtening of national Services and the setting up of the Centre are among the medium-term and long-term measures intended to minimize the effects of climatological disasters and to improve the living conditions of the inhabitants of this area. Each national project comprises:

the services of an expert for two years, responsible for supervising meteorological and agrometeorological activities undertaken in the country;

the supply of equipment for strenghtening the networks;

granting fellowships;

hydrological activities undertaken under a subcontract with ORSTOM (except the Gambia).

The Centre comprises:

the services of a Programme Co-ordinator responsible for the management and implementation of the entire programme;

the services of four instructors in meteorology (2), agrometeorology (1) and climatology (1);

Title of post.—Administrative Officer.

Duration .- Three years, initial contract of one year.

When required.—1st January, 1977 or as soon as possible thereafter.

Duty station.-Niamey (Niger).

Duties.—The candidate selected will be in the Office of the Programme Co-ordinator for strengthening the agrometeorological and hydrological services of the Sahelian countries and the establishment of a Centre for training and applications of agrometeorology/operational hydrology (a brief description of this project will be found in the annex). He will be attached to the Programme Co-ordinator whom he will assist in the following fields:

- (a) general correspondence with governmental and non-governmental services with whom the office should lisse, and also with WMO;

EXPLANATORY NOTE

Programme for strengthening the Agrometeorological and Hydrological Services of the Sahelian countries and establishment of a Centre for training and applications of agrometeorology/operational hydrology

The strengthening of national Services and the setting up of the Centre are among the medium-term and long-term measures intended to minimize the effects of climatological disasters and to improve the living conditions of the inhabitants of this area. The seven countries affected by the drought have set up a

joint body in order to combine their efforts: the Permanent inter-State Committee for the Fight Against Drought in the Sahel (CILSS). These countries are: the Gambia, Upper Volta, Mali, Mauritania, Niger, Senegal and Chad.

The present programme consists of:

Seven national projects intended to develop the agrometeorological and hydrological observational networks, to strengthen services for data processing and providing users with short-term forecasts, and lastly, the training of technical personnel required for these tasks;

a regional Centre to provide training for these personnel. This Centre will subsequently have personnel and equipment for data processing on a regional basis.

Each national project comprises:

the services of an expert for two years, responsible for supervising meteorological and agrometeorological activities undertaken in the country;

the supply of equipment for strengthening the networks;

granting fellowships;

hydrological activities undertaken under a subcontract with ORSTOM (except the Gambia). The Centre comprises:

the services of a Programme Co-ordinator responsible for the management and implementation of the entire programme;

the services of four instructors in meteorology (2), agrometeorology (1) and climatology (1);

the services of two experts in operational hydrology responsible for planning and supervising the work of the sub-contractor;

the supply of didactic material.

It is also proposed to add data processing facilities on a regional scale by attaching two experts, providing data processing equipment and a telecommunication network for the collection and redistribution of these data.

The duration of these operations will be five years for the Centre and two years for the national projects.
