FOOD AND DRUGS DECREE (No. 35) 1974

Notice to all Manufacturers and Distributors
of Food, Drugs and Cosmetics

All manufacturers and Distributors of food, drugs and cosmetics are hereby reminded that the Food and Drugs Decree (No. 35) 1974 came into force on the 10th of February, 1976. The main objective of the decree and the regulations being prepared under it is to protect the health of the consumers by ensuring that only food that is safe, wholesome and of high nutritive value, or drugs and cosmetics which are safe, wholesome and efficacious are made available to the Nigerian consumers.

In compliance with section 9 of the decree Food and Drugs Inspecting Officers have now been appointed and deployed to various parts of the country. The duties of these officers vis-a-vis the obligations

of the manufacturers and distributors are well set out in the decree. All persons or firms who engage in the manufacture and distribution of any products covered by this decree and therefore, advised in their own interest, not only to take steps as may necessary not to infringe any of the provisions of the law but also to co-operate fully with the Inspecting Officers who call from time to time at their premises for inspection.

FOOD AND DRUGS DECREE (No. 35) 1974

Notice to All Importers of Food

Attention of all importers of food and food products is hereby drawn to the provisions of the Food and Drugs Decree (No. 35) 1974, which require among other, that no article of food, drugs or cosmetics will be allowed into this country except under specified conditions. These conditions are set out in section 8 of the decree and is reproduced below for the convenience of those not yet familiar with the decree.

"The Commissioner or any person authorised by him in that behalf may order the manufacturer of any article of food, drug, cosmetic or device to furnish a declaration in the prescribed form that the article in question was manufactured in accordance with the provisions of this Decree and the regulations, and it shall be the duty of the manufacturer to comply with the requirements of the order.

2. Save as provided by the regulations, no article of food, drug, cosmetic or device shall be imported or otherwise brought into Nigeria unless :-

(a) it is accompanied by a certificate from the manufacturer to the effect that it was manufactured in accordance with any existing standard or code of practice pertaining to such product or, where such standard or code of practice does not exist or the particular product, in accordance with any international standard laid down, in the case of food, under the directive of the Codex Alimentarius Commission; and

(b) a certificate issued by or on behalf of the Government of the country where it was manufactured to the effect that its sale in that country would not constitute a contravention of law of that country.

(3) Notwithstanding anything contained in the foregoing provisions of this section, the Commissioner may by regulations provide that any such article as is mentioned in subsection (2) above shall not be imported into Nigeria unless it was manufactured in accordance with any standards that may be specified in the regulations".

Food "includes any article manufactured, sold or advertised for use as food or drink for man, chewing gum, and any ingredient that may be mixed with food for any purpose whatever, but does not include—

(i) water, or live animals, birds or fish,

(ii) fodder or feeding stuffs for animals, birds or fish other than supplements produced for addition to animal and poultry foodstuffs, or

(iii) articles or substances used only as drugs".

All importers of any products covered by this decree are advised in their own interest to ensure that every consignment is accompanied on arrival by an appropriate certificate of analysis without which the consignment will not be allowed entry into Nigeria.

A number of Food and Drugs Inspecting Officers have already been posted to the ports to ensure compliance with the provisions of the decree. All importers of the affected products are advised to co-operate with them in order to avoid unnecessary delays in the clearing of their consignments.

It is notified for general information that the Board is prepared to consider applications from persons, firms, etc. in any of the three States of Oyo, Ondo and Ogun for appointment as licensed buying agents under the 1977 Palm Kernels and Palm Oil Marketing Schemes.

2. An applicant will be required to produce evidence that he is able to fulfil the minimum conditions set out in the following paragraphs, which are based on :—

(a) the normal functions which a licensed buying agent is required to perform under the existing marketing schemes ;

(b) ability to purchase with reasonable regularity throughout the duration of the scheme the following minimum quantities :

(c) stipulated conditions as regards storage, evacuation, etc.

3. FUNCTIONS OF LICENSED BUYING AGENTS

The main functions which licensed buying agents will be required to perform on behalf of the Board are :—

(i) to grade palm kernels and palm oil at gazetted buying stations ;

(ii) to bag and arrange for inspection in accordance with the regulations ;

(iii) to provide suitable storage until the time of evacuation to port ;

(iv) to make returns of gradings and stocks as the Board or its duly authorised executive may require ;

(v) to arrange for conveyance and delivery of palm kernels and palm oil to VON and Apapa according to instructions which may be issued from time to time by the Board's Executive.

4. MINIMUM CONDITIONS

(a) Applicants will be required to produce acceptable evidence of their ability to provide the necessary capital to finance their purchases. The minimum capital requirements are as follows :—

Palm Kernels	8,000.00
Palm Oil	6,000.00

Applicants will be required to forward, as evidence of their ability to satisfy the minimum capital requirement, copies of their bank statements for the six months preceding the date of application, duly certified by their bankers. Only applications to which such bank statements have been attached will be considered.

(e) *General* : An applicant must be prepared to produce satisfactory evidence that he is fully conversant with the palm kernels and palm oil trade and that in particular he will be able to fulfil the following conditions :—

(i) *Inspection of Produce*.—That he will be able to provide grading equipment and an adequate labour force at all stores.

(ii) *Returns*.—That he will render promptly and accurately all returns particularly of gradings and stocks, which may be called for by the Board's Executive.

(iii) *Evacuation*.—That he will be able to make arrangements to secure the necessary transport to ensure smooth and regular evacuation of produce by approved routes.

It is notified for general information that the Board is prepared to consider applications from persons in any of the three States of Oyo, Ondo and Ogun for appointment as licensed buying agents for the 1976-77 Coffee Season which will open in due course. The exact date will be notified by publication in this *Gazette*.

2. Applicants will be required to indicate the State/States in which they intend to operate and produce evidence that they are likely to be able to fulfil the minimum conditions set out in the following paragraphs, which are based on :—

(a) the normal functions which a licensed buying agent is required to perform ;

(b) ability to purchase and handle a minimum purchase requirement of 200 tonnes.

(c) stipulated conditions as regards storage, evacuation, etc.

3. FUNCTIONS OF LICENSED BUYING AGENTS

The main functions which licensed buying agents will be required to perform on behalf of the Board are :—

- (a) to grade coffee at buying stations at not less than the minimum prices ;
- (b) to bag and arrange for inspection in accordance with the regulations ;
- (c) to finance purchases and provide suitable storage until the time of evacuation to port ;
- (d) to make returns of gradings and stocks as the Board or its duly authorised Executive may require ;
- (e) to arrange for conveyance and delivery of coffee to Apapa according to instructions which may be issued from time to time by the Board's Executive ;
- (f) to comply with regulations and instructions regarding check-weighing and inspection at port.

4. MINIMUM CONDITIONS

(a) *Purchases* : Applicants must produce evidence of ability to purchase with reasonable regularity throughout a season a minimum of 200 tonnes of coffee.

(b) Applicants must produce evidence of necessary organisation to ensure proper performance of the duties of a licensed buying agent.

(c) *Storage* : Applicants must be able to provide evidence that they have available in their proposed areas of operation proper storage for at least one hundred tonnes of coffee. All stores must comply with the requirement of and be approved by the State Produce Inspection Service. It is the responsibility of the applicant to request, in writing, the Produce Officer of the area concerned to inspect and approve his stores.

(d) *Capital* : Applicants will be required to produce acceptable evidence of their ability to satisfy the minimum capital requirement necessary to fulfil the obligations of a licensed buying agent. The minimum capital requirement is ₦10,000.

(e) *General* : Applicants must be prepared to produce satisfactory evidence to show that they are fully conversant with the coffee trade and likely to be able to fulfil the following conditions :—

(i) *Inspection of Coffee*.—That they will be able to provide an adequate labour force at all stores to handle coffee at the time of inspection.

(ii) *Returns*.—That they will render promptly and accurately all returns, particularly of gradings and stocks, which may be called for.

(iii) *Evacuation*.—(a) That they will be able to make arrangement to secure the necessary transport to ensure the smooth and regular evacuation of coffee by approved routes.
