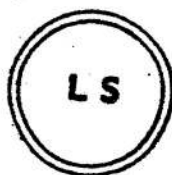

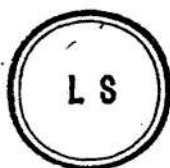

This indifference of the farmers in Bangladesh has led to low production of milk per cow which is less than 2 lbs. per cow per day. A built-in situation exists in Bangladesh today whereby rural milk production in milk pockets can be effectively and efficiently tied up with the urban requirements of milk supplies.

The major objective of the project is to provide technical services and guidance in building up an integrated co-operative dairy complex which will be owned and operated by a milk producers' co-operatives union of 500 to 1,000 village milk producers, co-operatives. It will reorganise or improve the working system of the existing village milk producers' co-operative society; establish a suitable milk procurement system; train local staff in assessment of milk potential in rural areas; assist in the processing of milk and dairy products; and assist in organising a system of effective use of dairy and animal husbandry extension activities. The main location of the project is in Dacca and the satellite dairy farms in Tangail, Mankganj, Faridpur, Pabna and the areas covered by the dairy complex.

**Duties.**—Under the general supervision of the Project Manager, the Consultant will assist the management of the Co-operative Dairy Complex in marketing matters. He will specifically assist in :

1. Advising how the market for milk and milk products in Bangladesh should be surveyed to establish short and long-term sales potentials.

2. Advising how these sales potentials could be tapped by the Co-operative by suggesting ways in which demand for milk in particular and other milk products in general could be stimulated to ensure continued sales growth.

3. Advising on the establishment and running of distribution and retailing systems for milk and milk products suitable for the prevailing climatic conditions.

4. Setting up as required a market intelligence system whereby sales trends and sales figures are collected and interpreted accordingly. This scheme should also include a means of relating daily orders or products to production requirements so that returns due to over-ordering are kept to a minimum.

5. Setting up a scheme for training counterpart staff in marketing techniques.

6. Generally co-ordinating sales efforts so that the continued prosperity of the co-operative and the dairy industry in Bangladesh, as a whole, is secured and the consuming public adequately protected.
