NIGERIAN ENTERPRISES PROMOTION BOARD

COMPLIANCE BY ENTERPRISES AFFECTED BY SECTION 7 (1) OF THE
NIGERIAN ENTERPRISES PROMOTION DECREE No. 3 1977

The Nigerian Enterprises Promotion Board would like to remind alien enterprises whose activities are covered by section 7 (1) of the Nigerian Enterprises Promotion Decree, 1977 that they are required to comply with the provisions of the said Decree by 30th June, 1977. For ease of reference, section 7 (1) of the Decree reads as follows :

".....any alien who immediately before the commencement of this Decree was the owner or part-owner of any body corporate carrying on an enterprise the business of which comprised enterprises specified in Schedules 1, 2 and 3 to this Decree or in any two of those schedules may after the appointed date continue to be owner or part-owner of any such body corporate if—

(a) the annual turn-over of the body corporate was not less than ₦25,000,000 ;

(b) the business of the body corporate was being carried on in not less than 10 states in the Federation;

(c) the equity participation of Nigerian citizens or associations is by the 30th June, 1977 not less than sixty per cent."

2. The Nigerian Enterprises Promotion Board and the Capital Issues Commission are making arrangements to ensure that all alien enterprises whose businesses are covered by the provisions of Section 7 (1) of the Decree fully comply with those provisions by the stipulated date of 30th June, 1977. Affected enterprises should note that, in accordance with Sections 9 (2) and 9 (5) of the Decree, the Capital Issues Commission

will be responsible for determining the prices at which the shares of all affected enterprises are to be sold or transferred. Affected enterprises are warned that the Capital Issues Commission will not determine the price of the shares of any such enterprise until and unless the Commission has been advised by the Nigerian Enterprises Promotion Board that the enterprise has fully satisfied the conditions stipulated in Sections 7 (1) (a) and 7 (1) (b) of the Decree.

3. All affected enterprises are, therefore, requested to submit to the Nigerian Enterprises Promotion Board verifiable documentary evidence in support of their claim that they are covered by the provisions of the said Section 7 (1) of the Decree. Affected enterprises are advised, in their own interest to ensure that such documentary evidence reach the Secretary, Nigerian Enterprises Promotion Board, as soon as possible but not later than Friday, 4th March, 1977.
