

Programme for strengthening the Agrometeorological and Hydrological Services of the Sahelian countries and establishment of a Centre for training and applications of agrometeorology/operational hydrology.

The strenthening of national services and the setting up of the Centre are among the medium-term and long-term measures intended to minimize the effects of climatological disasters and to improve the living conditions of the inhabitants of this area.
