Whereas by section 50 (2) of the Constitution of the former Eastern Nigeria as modified by the Constitution (Basic Provisions) Decree 1975 and the States (Creation and Transitional Provisions) Decree 1976 it is provided that the Judges of the High Court of each of the States created out of the former Eastern Nigeria shall be the Chief Justice of the State and such number of other Judges (not being less than six) as may be prescribed by law:

AND WHEREAS by section 51 (1) of the Constitution of the former Eastern Nigeria modified as aforesaid it is provided that the Chief Justice of the State and the other Judges of the High Court of the State shall be appointed by the Supreme Military Council, acting after consultation with the Advisory Judicial Committee:

Now, THEREFORE, THE SUPREME MILITARY COUNCIL, acting after consultation with the Advisory Judicial Committee, do hereby appoint MR JUSTICE AMBROSE ALLAGOA as the Chief Justice of the Rivers State with effect from 1st day of July, 1976.

Whereas by section 50 (2) of the Constitution of the former Northern Nigeria as modified by the Constitution (Basic Provisions) Decree 1975 and the States (Creation and Transitional Provisions) Decree 1976 it is provided that the Judges of the High Court of each of the States created out of the former Northern Nigeria shall be the Chief Judge of the State and such number of other Judges (not being less than two) as may be prescribed by law:

AND WHEREAS by section 51 (6) of the said Constitution of the former Northern Nigeria modified as afore-said it is provided that if the office of any Judge of the High Court of the State other than the Chief Judge is vacant or if the person holding the office is acting as Chief Judge or is for any reason unable to perform the functions of his office, the Supreme Military Council acting after consultation with the Advisory Judicial Committee, may appoint a person with such qualifications as may be prescribed by law to act in the office of a Judge of the High Court:
