3. Qualifications.—(i) All applicants for post (a)-(d) must possess a degree from a recognised University in the field of study for which employment is being sought, plus a professional qualification

in Special Education where the degree is not in Special Education. Diplomas and professional Certificates in Special fields plus a considerable teaching and/or administrative experience may be considered in special cases.

(ii) For posts (e)-(g), relevant professional qualifications, diplomas or certificates, plus a considerable on-the-job experience will be considered.

(iii) Qualifications in more than one area or field of study will be an advantage.

4. Qualifications and Experience.—(a) Principal Education Officers and Principal Lecturers : A post-graduate teaching/administrative experience of not less than 8 years in Ordinary and Special Education. Experience in for-ordination of handicapped education programmes at teacher training levels will be considered an advantage.

(b) Senior Education Officers and Senior Lecturers.—A post-graduate teaching/administrative, experience of not less than 6 years in Ordinary and Special Education. Experience at teacher training levels will be considered an advantage.

(c) Education Officers/Lecturers, Grade I.—As for (b) except that the relevant years of experience should be 4 years instead of 6.

(d) Library Officer.—A Diploma in Librarianship or professional qualification in librarianship with relevant experience in educational institutions. He will be expected to set up from scratch a reference, lending and departmental (including Braille) libraries for the college.

(e) Brailist.—A qualified teacher with a post-qualification training in braille. He must have had at least 4 years experience as instructor in braille.

(f) Audiologist.—He will be required to set up and maintain an audiology laboratory. He should have knowledge of room acoustics and be conversant with design performance and use of various hearing aids, audiometers and sound level meters.

(g) Educational Technologist.—A technology engineer with experience in closed circuit television Visual Aid and programmed hearing. He will be required to set up a micro-teaching unit, produce, edit films and video tapes, and maintain the equipment in serviceable condition.

5. Salary.—Salaries attached to posts outlined in paragraph 1 (a) to (g) above are as follows :—

Note.—Point of entry will depend on qualifications and experience. For the brailist the grade level at which to be appointed will depend on the basic qualification before certification in Braille.

6. Conditions.—Appointment is on either permanent or on contract basis or a secondment for an agreed period. Only indigenous officers will be appointed on permanent basis or secondment ; appointment on contract will be for two tours or between 18 and 24 months depending on age. A contract officer will be paid 10 per cent contract addition.

There is also an expatriate allowance of ₦360-₦600 payable by the Nigerian Government. In addition a ₦360-₦600 tax-free supplement (payable in Britain) ranging from \$700 (single) may be payable to citizens of the U.K. or Eire. The award of this supplement will be decided by the Overseas Development Administration. Additional benefits for such people include educational allowance, holiday visit passages for children, and an appointment grant of \$200 for a married man accompanied by his family or \$150 for a single or an unaccompanied married man. Special Teachers allowance is payable to deserving personnel.

7. *Housing*.—Quarters with hard furnishing, where available, will be provided at a rental not exceeding ₦300 per annum.

Knowledge of the development of management techniques such as programme budgeting, cost-benefit analysis, network analysis (CPM, PERT and similar techniques), linear programming, work sampling, statistical analysis, and work measurement techniques as applied to office situations. Ability to participate as a member of a team of O+ M Officers or, as required to independently carry out surveys to completion. Ability to write concise and clear reports and to utilize and adapt modern review techniques to practical management and organizational problems. VACANCY FOR POST OF DIRECTOR

Applications are invited for the post of Director, Commonwealth Bureau of Nutrition. The present Director, Miss D. L. Duncan, B.Sc., Ph.D, is due to retire in June 1978, and her successor will be expected to join the Bureau early in 1978.

General Information.—The Bureau is one of a group of information centres under the control of the Executive Council of the Commonwealth Agricultural Bureaux, and is housed in the Rowett Research Institute, Bucksburn. Close association with the Institute provides opportunity for contact with scientists actively engaged in research on Livestock nutrition.

The main work of the Bureau is to collect and disseminate to research workers information on the nutrition of man and animals and its implications for agriculture and human welfare. This is done largely through the medium of two monthly journals (*Nutrition Abstracts and Reviews: Series A—Human and Experimental; Series B—Livestock Feeds and Feeding*), which contain abstracts made by the staff of the Bureau following a comprehensive survey of relevant scientific papers published world-wide. The abstracts are regarded by scientists as an indispensable source of reference. Like all others in the CAB series, the two journals in machine-readable form are accessible on-line through the DIALOG system.

An Advisory Committee comprising representatives of the Bureau, the Rowett Research Institute and the medical world, is in being to advise on the scientific content of the Journals.

Duties.—The Director is responsible for all the information services provided by the Bureau, for maintaining the high standards of the journals and for day-to-day management.

Qualifications.—Applications with appropriate scientific qualifications should have had experience in agriculture, veterinary or human medicine, or in one of the biological sciences basic to nutrition. Familiarity with administration is required. Experience in editorial work and the production of scientific publications would be an advantage. A knowledge of European languages other than English is desirable.

Terms and conditions.—Salary is in the scale £5,514-5,687-5,855-6,107-6,392-6,664-6,921-£7,205 p.a. plus pay supplements of £522 p.a. The starting salary will relate to qualifications and experience.

The emoluments are inclusive, but travelling and subsistence allowances on the recognized scales are granted when travelling. There are four increment dates—1st January, 1st April, 1st July and 1st October—the first increment being due, subject to satisfactory service, twelve months from the next increment date after the date of joining the Bureau.

The successful applicant would be required to become a member of the Federated Superannuation System for Universities (FSSU) or a new CAB Superannuation Scheme (1978) to be introduced on 1st April, 1978. Under FSSU, insurance policies at the

officer's selection are taken out, the premium being equivalent to 15 per cent of salary, of which one-third is recoverable by deduction from salary, the remaining two-thirds being contributed by the Executive Council. A taxable but non-superannuable compensatory allowance of 4½ per cent of basic salary is payable to offset personal contribution to FSSU. Under the new CAB Superannuation Scheme (1978), members will be contracted-out of the State Scheme which begins on 6th April, 1978.

Annual leave and sick leave are allowed according to regulations. During the first 10 years' service, annual leave totals 5 weeks each year (i.e. 25 working days on a 5-day week basis); thereafter, 6 weeks is allowed each year. The leave year commences on 1st January.

Normal retiring age is 60, but this may be extended to 65.
