WHEREAS by section 111 (2) of the Constitution of the Federation as modified by the Constitution (Basic Provisions) Decree 1975 it is provided that the Judges of the Supreme Court of Nigeria shall be the Chief Justice of Nigeria and such number of Justices of the Supreme Court (not being less than five) as may be prescribed by law:

And whereas by section 112 (1a) of the Constitution of the Federation as modified by the Constitution (Amendment) Decree 1972 and the Constitution (Basic Provisions) Decree 1975, it is provided that the Justices of the Supreme Court shall be appointed by the Supreme Military Council, acting after consultation with the Advisory Judicial Committee:

Background.—The central theme in the Fourth Five Year Development Plan for Kenya (1979-83) is alleviation of poverty. The Government of Kenya aims to achieve this objective by ensuring that all people are given the opportunity for full social and economic development by providing access to resources and knowledge necessary to meet their basic needs such as adequate food, clean water, health, education and income generating opportuni-ties. Kenya's most deprived human population resides in the arid and semi-arid lands which cover 80 per cent of its land area. The people of these lands are either pastoralists or subsistence farmers who, for lack of opportunity or incentive for social and technical advancement, are at present subjected to a life style that limits both their own development and that of the national economy. Scanty and erratic rainfall together with resource degradation have led to declining productivity. Recurrent crop failures lead to hunger and great suffering which can only be alleviated by costly famine relief operations. Agricultural research activities have in the past concentrated on the needs of the higher potential areas in Kenya. Research-tested improvements on traditional production systems in arid and semi-arid areas are few or lacking. The technology of the indigenous people in these arid and semi-arid areas is adapted to more extensive, mainly pastoral agricultural systems which are applicable under situations of low population pressures. Migrant populations from the crowded high potential areas bring with them farming technology which is inappropriate to marginal rainfall situations. As a result there are frequent crop failures and increasing resource degradation. The Government of Kenya recognises the serious situation in these areas and is therefore as a matter of urgency committed to a wide ranging programme of economic and social development of these areas. The development objectives of these areas are :-

(a) to evolve well developed and less risky farming systems that make semi-arid areas self-reliant for food requirements and attain higher and

sustained total agricultural productivity while at the same time conserving and upgrading the status of the natural resources;

- (b) to integrate semi-arid lands more closely into the main stream of national economic activity;
- (c) to develop an agricultural support infrastructure including research, extension, co-operatives, input supplies, marketing, storage, credit services, feeder roads and water supplies.

Duties.—The principal responsibility of the pest control expert will be to determine the extent to which various types of pests limit crop production in marginal rainfall areas at various stages of production.
