It is notified for the information of intending candidates that the competition for entry into the Administrative Cadre and the Special Departmental Cadres of Auditors, Accountants, Assistant Registrars of Co-operative Societies, Produce Officers and Inspectors of Taxes, all in Grade Level 08, in the Oyo State of Nigeria Public Service will start in January 1980.

#### 2. The competition will consist of:

- (a) a qualifying written examination (for candidates applying for entry into the Administrative Officer Cadre) to be conducted by the West African Examinations Council;
- (b) a series of test and interviews, known as the Extended Interviews to be conducted by the Public Service Selection Board; and
- (c) an interview before the Public Service Commission.

Only candidates who attain the qualifying standard in the written examinations will be invited for the tests and interviews to be conducted by the Public Service Section Board. On the basis of candidates performance at the Extended Interview and the final round of interviews by the Public Service Commission, the Commissioners will select the most suitable candidates.

- 3. To be eligible for admission to the competition, a candidate who is not already a serving officer in the Oyo State of Nigeria Public Service must hold a Degree from a recognised University, or alternatively in the case of the professional Special Departmental Cadres of Auditors, Accountants and Inspectors of Taxes, a recognised professional qualification, i.e., the Final Certificate or Associate Membership of any of the following Professional Bodies:
  - (i) Institute of Chartered Accountants;
  - (ii) Association of Certified and Corporate Accountants;
  - (iii) Institute of Cost and Management Accountants;
  - (iv) Institute of Municipal Treasurers and Accountants;

Note.—(1) For the Special Departmental Class of Assistant Registrars of Co-operative Societies, a degree in Economics is preferable and for the Class of Produce Officers, the Degree must be either in Agriculture or Economics.

4. Candidates applying for the post of Auditor, Accountant or Inspector of Taxes who possess a good degree (either general with honours or distinction or special honours) in Accountancy of a recognised University or any of the qualifications listed in paragraph 3 (i)—(iv) above are exempted from the

written examination and the Extended Interviews mentioned in paragraph 2 (a) and (b) above. They need not pay the \$\frac{1}{2}40.00\$ fee mentioned in paragraph 7 below when submitting their applications. They will however be interviewed by the Public Service Commissioners. Similarly, candidates applying for the posts of Produce Officer and Assistant Registrar of Co-operative Societies, respectively, need not pay the fee of \$\frac{1}{2}40.00\$ and are exempted from the written Examinations but they would be required to attend the Extended Interviews and the Public Service Commissioners' Interview.

- (i) It is necessary for candidates to apply for not more than two posts for which they would be interviewed either at the Extended Interview or the Commissioners' Interview or both.
- (ii) "Recognised" University in the context of paragraph 3 above means recognised by the Government of Oyo State of Nigeria.
- 5. Candidates who are sitting for examinations leading to any of the qualifications listed in paragraph 3 above in 1980 will also be eligible for admission to the competition on the understanding that if they fail to secure the appropriate qualifications, they will automatically drop out of the competition. University undergraduates who have to serve for one year in the compulsory National Youth Service Corps can participate in the Competition but consideration for their appointment into any of the posts will, among other things, be subject to the production of a discharge certificate issued by the Directorate of the National Youth Service.
- 6. The Written Examination for those applying for Administrative Officer post will not be designed to test candidates on the subjects in which they hold academic degree, but to test their ability to think clearly and understand and effectively communicate in the English Language and, also, their knowledge of current affairs and social issues, with particular reference to West Africa.
  - (i) English (Precis and Critical Appreciation.— This paper will consists of a precis of a passage supplemented by a question asking candidates to comment critically on the central idea of the passage.
  - (ii) Current Affairs.—This will be in two parts. Paper I will consist of three questions of the traditional Essay type, all of which must be answered. Paper II an objective test, will consist of fifty questions, all of which must also be answered. In both papers the range of questions will be such as will cater for the graduate, the university student as well as the non-graduate. The questions are intended to test the intelligent awareness of current affairs which any educated person may reasonably be presumed to possess.
  - (iii) General.—This will consist of two questions, one will test ability to detect dubious thinking and will contain short passages, the logical force of which is to be discussed critically. The other will test ability to draw statistical inferences from a table of numerical data.

7. The Written Examination will be held on 24th and 25th January, 1980 in Lagos, Ibadan, Ile-Ife, Zaria, Jos, London, Washington and at such other centres as may be determined later. Admission notices showing the necessary details including candidates examination numbers will be sent direct to individual candidates by the West African Examinations Council. Each candidate will be required to pay an examination fee of N40.00 which is not refundable.

8. Serving Officers are being informed of the special arrangements affecting them in a separate circular letter being released simultaneously. Other candidates who have already applied for Form OYSPCS 1 for appointment to the Administrative Officer post should, if in Nigeria, send to the Secretary, Public Service Commission, Treasury Receipt for the \$\frac{1}{4}0.00\$ competition fee (to be credited to Revenue Head 335: Public Service Examination Fees) or, if outside Nigeria, send an equivalent of \$\frac{1}{4}0.00\$ by crossed Money Order or Postal Order to the authority to whom they addressed their applications on Form OYSPSC 1 under a covering letter referring to their applications.
