APPLICATION FOR AN OIL PIPELINE LICENCE  
16" O.D. PIPELINE

1. Notice is hereby given in accordance with Section 8 of the Oil Pipeline Act 1965 (Cap. 145) that the Nigerian National Petroleum Corporation, whose registered office is at Falomo Office Complex, Ikoyi, Lagos, has applied to the Nigerian National Petroleum Corporation for the grant of a licence to enter upon, take possession of and use of a period of twenty (20) years a strip of land for the purpose of laying a 16" Pipeline from a proposed compressor station at Eriemu to the new road leading to the Delta Steel Complex at Aladja. This strip of land is situated in the Bendel State. The route is demarcated on the ground with pillars in concrete and herein described.

## DESCRIPTION

## BACKGROUND INFORMATION

The World Intellectual Property Organization at present handles manually some 1,000 international trademark registrations per month. These registrations are published through traditional printing methods in the journal "Les Marques internationales", which is issued monthly.

Trademarks are registered for 10 or 20 years and each trademark has generally, during this period, several changes made concerning its renewal, its owner or owner's agent's name and/or address, etc. which need to be recorded in the International Register and published; each registration, renewal or change gives rise to the collection of an appropriate fee. The number of active trademarks in the International Register is at present some 250,000.

It is proposed to computerize most of the operation through the building of a data base which would enable as a first stage the producing of the journal (some 250 pages monthly) by photocomposition techniques and as a second stage the computerization of most of the trademark registration operations, including fee collection, statistics, summary tables, etc.

The estimated volume of data entry with the full system in operation is 20 million characters per year.
